About the Trees Network

The RMU Trees Network provides services and training to enhance the support for children and adolescents with intellectual disabilities and their families through professional preparation of teachers, continued professional development of teachers and service providers, and direct services to children and families. As part of our outreach to families, we host a parent support group, informational workshops, and other educational opportunities. In addition, family members are encouraged to contact the Trees Network for information, advocacy, referrals, and resources. We welcome partnerships with other educational institutions, nonprofits, and community service organizations.

Virtual Parent Support Group/Workshop

We host a virtual parent support group the **first Monday of each month.** The group connects parents to others who are facing similar experiences. It also provides resources to support parents. Parents can attend individual sessions or attend every month. It is held through Google Meets. Our next parent support group will be **Monday, December 5**th **from 7:00 - 8:00 pm**. This month, the support group meeting is in the format of a workshop. Consultants from PaTTAN will be providing an informative session for parents on **Collaborative and Proactive Solutions (CPS).** The schools have a variety of approaches to address behaviors in the school and the terminology can be confusing.
