Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team opens up a two-game road trip Sunday, Nov. 26, when it travels to Orono, Maine, for a 1:00 p.m. contest against the University of Maine. The Colonials are coming off a 77-64 victory over New Hampshire (11/21/06) to run their record to 3-0, just the second time in the program's 31-year history an RMU club has started a season with three straight wins. A victory Sunday over the Black Bears would push Robert Morris to 4-0 for the first time in school history. After their tilt with Maine, the Colonials close out their road swing with a 7:30 p.m. contest against Pittsburgh at the Petersen Events Center Wednesday, Nov. 29.

Quick Stat of the Night - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has gotten off to a quick start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 season, as he enters Sunday's game against Maine leading the club in both scoring (25.0 ppg) and rebounding (10.3 rpg). Despite averaging 25.0 points per game in the first three contests of the season, the majority of Jackson's offensive prowess has come after halftime. So far this season Jackson has scored just 15 points in the first 20 minutes of action, yet after the break has scored 60 points. In the second half so far Jackson has converted 55.9 percent (19-for-34) of his field goal attempts, including a shooting percentage of 58.3 percent (7-for-12) from beyond the arc.

Sunday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - Maine and RMU meet for just the fourth time Sunday afternoon, with the Colonials owning a 3-0 record in the all-time series. Robert Morris garnered a 62-53 victory over the Black Bears in the meeting between the two clubs last year at the Charles L. Sewall Center (11/28/05). Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** led the way in that contest with 18 points and 14 rebounds despite the fact that the Colonials shot just 31.9 percent (21-for-51) from the floor on the game. RMU's only other visit to Orono, Maine, came Dec. 30, 1989, when the Colonials downed the Black Bears, 73-57, to improve to 7-3 on the season.

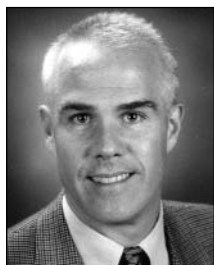

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 68-79 (.463), including a 49-43 (.533) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Black Bears - Maine enters Sunday's game winners of two straight after downing the College of St. Joseph (11/22/06), 97-69. In that victory five players scored in double figures, led by senior guard Chris Bruff and sophomore forward Philippe Tchekane Bofia, who each scored 18 points. Prior to its win over the College of St. Joseph the Black Bears garnered a 79-60 win over Northeast Conference foe St. Francis (N.Y.) (11/18/06). In that game senior guard Kevin Reed exploded for 30 points, finishing 10-for-19 from the field, including 8-for-11 from beyond the three-point arc. Tchekane Bofia enters Sunday's game with a team-best scoring average of 13.0 points per game.

Maine Head Coach - The 2006-07 campaign marks **Ted Woodward's** (Bucknell '86) third season as head coach at Maine. He owns an overall record of 28-34 (.452). Prior to being named the 20th head coach in Maine history, Woodward spent the previous eight years as an assistant with the Black Bears, including associate head coach during the 2003-04 campaign.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris opened the second half on a 21-5 run to turn a two-point deficit into a 55-41 lead en route to a 77-64 victory over New Hampshire Nov. 21. The victory improves the Colonials to 3-0 on the 2006-07 campaign, marking just the second time in the program's 31-year history an RMU team has started the season with three straight wins. The other time it happened came during the 1989-90 season. RMU jumped out to a 16-10 lead in the early going of the contest as junior guard **Tony Lee** poured it on offensively, scoring eight points in the opening salvo en route to a first-half performance in which he shot 5-for-7 from the field and 4-for-4 from the free-throw line for 14 points. The Colonials owned the lead the majority of the first half but watched as the Wildcats used a 16-12 spurt to take a two-point lead into the break, 36-34. A back-and-forth affair much of the first half, New Hampshire's Jermaine Anderson drained a three-pointer at the buzzer to send the Wildcats into halftime with a 36-34 lead. In the second half Robert Morris turned its defense up a notch and began pushing the ball to the post, as senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, held scoreless in the first half, came through offensively. He scored all 20 of his points in the second half on 6-of-10 shooting from the field and a perfect 4-for-4 from the charity stripe. He scored seven points during RMU's run to open the second half, while sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** added six points. Robert Morris pushed its lead to 15 on a pair of occasions, but New Hampshire was able to get its deficit down to single digits, 64-56, after a three-pointer by Tyrece Gibbs. Jackson answered Gibbs' three-pointer with one of his own, and the closest the Wildcats were able to get the rest of the way was nine points. Robert Morris shot 52.8 percent (28-for-53) from the floor on the contest, while New Hampshire converted 43.6 percent (24-for-55) of its shots. In the second half the Colonials converted 64 percent (16-of-25) of their shots from the floor while holding the Wildcats to a shooting percentage of 32.1 percent (9-for-28)

New Hampshire Game Notes - In the first half 30 of RMU's 34 points came from its guards ... In the second half senior forward **A.J. Jackson** finished 6-for-10 from the field, including a perfect 4-for-4 from beyond the arc ... RMU has converted 22 of its 40 shots (55 percent) from beyond the three-point line in two home games ... After shooting 55.6 percent (15-for-27) in the first half New Hampshire converted just 32.1 percent (9-for-28) of its shots after halftime ... Senior guard **Derek Coleman** played a full 40 minutes ... RMU won the battle of the boards, 31-29, but were out-rebounded, 12-11, on the offensive glass.

Role Playing - It's no secret that Robert Morris is going to get the majority of its offense from the "Big Four" in 2006-07, but a number of newcomers are already filling in holes and playing their roles nicely in the early portion of the season. Freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** came off the bench to supply RMU with seven points in a 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06) in 14 minutes of action, while sophomore forward **Iffy Ehirim** scored six points and grabbed four rebounds in just nine minutes of a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06). Through the first three games of the season Nwigwe and Ehirim have combined to shoot a solid 64.3 percent (9-for-14) from the field.

Selective Shot - Junior guard **Tony Lee** is one of the aforementioned "Big Four" for Robert Morris, yet he quietly and consistently puts up numbers in all categories throughout the course of a game. The key for Lee so far this season has been his selective shooting, as in the first three games thus far he has converted **65.2** percent (**15-for-23**) of his field goals. He's coming off a complete game in RMU's 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06) when he finished with 18 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the floor and 4-for-4 from the charity stripe while adding five rebounds and tying a career high with five steals.

Freedom - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach **Mark Schmidt** has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. The Colonials opened their 2006-07 season in style from the charity stripe, hitting 10 of 12 shots in a 96-72 win over Florida International (11/13/06), a shooting percentage of 83.3 percent. RMU followed that up by converting just 91.7 percent (11-for-12) in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06). Overall under Schmidt Robert Morris has converted **71.9** percent of its shots from the charity stripe (**1,972-for-2,741**).

Clutch Charity - While Robert Morris only shot 69.2 percent (18-for-26) from the free-throw line its 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), the Colonials came through when they needed to. In the last 5:41 of the game when RMU turned an 11-point deficit into victory the Colonials were 6-for-7 from the charity stripe, a success rate of 85.7 percent. In contrast, during that same time span Marshall was 4-for-7 from the free-throw line. In the early going of the 2006-07 campaign Robert Morris has converted 12 of its 13 free-throw shots (92.3 percent) in the last five minutes of games.

Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris gets its 2006-07 season underway. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel RMU to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarter-finals.

Select Company - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Streaking - Thanks to double-figure scoring games in each of RMU's first three games of the 2006-07 season, senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has extended his double-figure scoring streak to 12 contests dating back to last season. Over that span Jackson is averaging 19.9 points per game and it marks his second streak of at least 10 games scoring in double figures in a Colonial uniform. The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career-high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman, who ranked 19th in Division I last season in three-point field goal percentage (42.3 percent), owns 10 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 151.

Double Vision - Junior guard **Tony Lee**, possibly the most intense player on the Colonial roster, recorded his 10th career double-double in RMU's 96-72 victory over Florida International (11/13/06) by scoring 13 points and establishing a career high with 10 assists. It marks Lee's first double-double of the point-assist variety, and it comes on the heels of a 2005-06 campaign in which he ranked eighth in the Northeast Conference in assists with an average of 3.4 per game.

Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 43-23 (.652) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 166-104 (.615).

Defense Wins Championships - Head coach **Mark Schmidt** has preached over the course of his six years as head coach that a suffocating defense will lead to victories, and his mantra has been proven correct. Under Schmidt, Robert Morris boasts a record of **51-17 (.750)** when holding opponents under 70 points a contest, including 2-0 on the 2006-07 season.

The Lights Get Brighter - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a virtual unknown entering the 2005-06 season, has been showered with preseason accolades entering the 2006-07 campaign. As well as earning a spot on the 2006-07 preseason All-NEC team after averaging 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game a year ago, Jackson has been named the NEC Preseason Player of the Year by five annual college basketball publications: *Athlon Sports*, *Lindy's College Basketball*, *Street & Smith's*, *USA Today Sports Weekly* and *The Sporting News*. The latest preseason honor came from the website midmajority.com, which picked Jackson as one of its nine Mid-Major Stars to Watch for the 2006-07 campaign.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks eighth all-time. A look at where Coleman ranks in career assists:

Creating & Creating II - Senior guard **Derek Coleman's** career-high 137 assists in 2005-06 helped him place his name in the top 10 in the Robert Morris single-season records. Coleman's total ranks tied for the eighth highest single-season total in school history with Andre Boyd (1987-1991), who dished out 137 assists in 1990-91. Coleman also became just the program's third player to lead the Northeast Conference in assists per game. He posted a league-best 4.72 assists per game average in 2005-06 and joined former Colonials Javier Smith (5.4 apg in 1996-97) and Wade Timmerman (6.5 apg in 1991-92) to pace the circuit in assists.

Five Against One - With the addition of seven new players in 2006-07, including four that stand 6'7" or taller, head coach **Mark Schmidt** will look to build depth on his bench and give his regular starters a breather. In 2005-06, forward's **A.J. Jackson** and **Cori Boston** and guards **Derek Coleman**, **Tony Lee** and **Jeremy Chappell**, all regular starters until Boston fell to an injury bug late in the season, combined for an amazing 84.7 percent (1,810-of-2,136) of RMU's offense and 74.5 percent (780-of-1,047) of the club's rebounds.

Settling In - With the return of senior center **Freddie Harris** in 2006-07, Robert Morris has the regular starting lineup that head coach **Mark Schmidt** envisioned before Harris went down with a foot injury five games into the 2005-06 campaign. Harris has started with fellow Colonials **A.J. Jackson**, **Derek Coleman**, **Tony Lee** and **Jeremy Chappell** just six times so far, with RMU owning a record of 5-1 in those games.

Three's Company - One could say that Robert Morris had its most prolific season in school history in regard to three-point shooting in 2005-06, establishing a new school record for team three-point field goals with 260. That total shattered the former school mark of 213, set in 2003-04. In 2005-06, the Colonials broke the single-season school record for three-pointers for the third time in five seasons under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. Over the course of the club's last 12 games of the 2005-06 campaign and the first three games of 2006-07 season, the Colonials are averaging an even **9.8** three-pointers per game while shooting **40.4** percent (**147-for-364**) from beyond the arc. In all, Robert Morris has drained at least **10** three-pointers in **12** of its last **17** contests.

Leaders of the Pack

The Northeast Conference features four schools with duos that combined to score at least 25.0 points per game in 2005-06. Topping the list for the third time in the last four years is Robert Morris, which features senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**. The duo, led by Jackson's 17.0 ppg average in 2005-06, combined to average 31.1 ppg last season. Chappell averaged 14.1 points per game as a freshman in 2005-06. Entering the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns, Robert Morris had the top returning scoring duo thanks to former forward Chaz McCrommon and former guard Maurice Carter. The top mark by an NEC returning scoring duo was McCrommon and Carter, who averaged 35.5 points game entering 2003-04.

Marshall Memorial Classic

39 On a Dime - One can point to senior forward **A.J. Jackson** as a key reason Robert Morris was able to hang around the upper half of the Northeast Conference standings in 2005-06. Jackson played an integral role for Robert Morris, and one only needs to look at his performance in an 89-77 victory over Quinnipiac (2/12/06) to understand why. Jackson established a career-high with 39 points in the win and also added 11 rebounds for his 13th double-double of the season while registering four blocks on the afternoon. To delve deeper into Jackson's impact, consider:

- His 39 points against Quinnipiac established a new Charles L. Sewall Center record for points by an RMU player, eclipsing the 35 former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) scored in a 71-62 win over Sacred Heart (2/5/04)
- The 39 points is also ties the second highest single-game scoring total in school history. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) scored 39 in RMU's season-opening victory @ Missouri-Kansas City (11/22/02)
- His 14 double-doubles on the 2005-06 season is a new single-season school record, breaking the former mark of 10 that was held by Anthony Dickens (1985-90), who accomplished the feat during the 1989-90 campaign
- With 259 rebounds in 2005-06, Jackson posted the most rebounds in a season since Dickens grabbed 271 in 1989-90. Jackson's total ranks third all-time in the single-season annals.

Round Mound of Rebound - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** was as consistent a contributor for Robert Morris in his first season in a Colonial uniform in 2005-06, as he finished the season tied for second in the Northeast Conference in rebounding (9.3 per game). Jackson trailed only Central Connecticut State's Obie Nwadike, who won the rebounding crown with an average of 10.3 caroms per contest, and tied with Wagner's Durrell Vinson (9.3 rpg). Only one Colonial in school history prior to Jackson's campaign in 2005-06 averaged better than 9.0 rebounds per game, when former Colonial Earl Cureton (1976-77) averaged 10.5 caroms a contest in RMU's inaugural Division I campaign in 1976-77. Jackson finishing third in the NEC in rebounding marks the highest showing by a Colonial since 1999-2000, when Steve Pettyjohn (1998-2000) finished second in the circuit (8.4 rpg).

Double Your Pleasure - Thanks to 15 points and 10 rebounds @ Long Island (2/16/06) last season, senior forward **A.J. Jackson** notched his Northeast Conference-best 14th double-double of the 2005-06 campaign. His 14 double-doubles established a new single-season school record, eclipsing the 10 former Colonial Anthony Dickens (1985-90) posted during the 1989-90 campaign. Jackson's 14 double-doubles was also the most by an NEC player since Central Connecticut State's Ron Robinson posted 14 in 2003-04.

Your History Lesson - RMU is the only school ever to jump from junior college to NCAA Division I in the same year (1976), and the Colonials are the NEC record holder for league titles and subsequent NCAA Tournament appearances with five. Robert Morris also is one of two NEC teams to own a victory in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a 64-54 win over Georgia Southern in the 1983 opening round game. RMU has never played in the NIT. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.54), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.41 three-pointers a game.
