Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team opens its 31st season of Division I basketball Monday night when it welcomes Sun Belt foe Florida International to the Charles L. Sewall Center for a 7:00 p.m. game. Under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt, the Colonials return four starters from a 2005-06 squad that finished with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in Northeast Conference action. It marked RMU's first winning season in six years and its first under Schmidt's guidance. Among the returning starters is senior forward A.J. Jackson, who averaged 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game to lead the club in both categories and was named to the 2006 All-NEC First Team. Also back for Robert Morris is sophomore Jeremy Chappell, who was named the 2006 NEC Rookie of the Year after averaging 14.1 points and 5.7 rebounds per game.

Quick Stat of the Night - Robert Morris enters Monday night's game with Florida International sporting an even 15-15 record all-time in season openers, including a 2-3 mark under current head coach Mark Schmidt. Monday's game against the Panthers marks the first time that the Colonials have opened their season with a home game since garnering a 58-53 win over East Carolina (11/19/99), a stretch of six seasons. In RMU's 13 previous season openers at home, the club has posted an 11-2 record, including a mark 5-2 in season openers at the Charles L. Sewall Center since the facility opened in 1985.

Monday's Opponent and the All-Time Series -

Florida International and Robert Morris will tipoff for just the fourth time in school history Monday night, with the Panthers holding a 2-1 advantage in the all-time series. In the last meeting between the two club the Colonials garnered an 85-67 win over FIU Jan. 4, 1990, at the Sewall Center. The Panthers garnered

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 65-79 (.451), including a 49-43 (.533) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Panthers - Monday night's game marks the second regular season contest for Florida International, as the Panthers will open their 2006-07 slate with a 7:30 p.m. contest @ Miami Saturday, Nov. 11. FIU is led by senior guard Johwen Villegas, the leading returning scorer for the Panthers. He averaged 10.4 points and 2.9 rebounds per game as a junior in 2005-06, leading the club in three-pointers with 74. Villegas shot 37.6 percent from beyond the arc and his 74 treys ranks fourth all-time in the FIU single-season records.

Florida International Head Coach - The 2006-07 campaign marks the third season for Sergio Rouco (Nova Southeastern '87) as head coach of Florida International. He has posted a 21-37 (.362) record in his first two seasons with the Panthers, including an 8-20 mark in 2005-06. His job as head coach marks his third stint with Florida International, as he served as an assistant coach with the Panthers under former head coach Rich Walker from 1987-91 and again under former coach Donnie Marsh from 2000-03. Florida International marks his first head coaching position.

RMU's Last Game - Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell hit his first five field goal attempts and Robert Morris cruised to a 104-68 victory over Division II Glenville State in an exhibition game Nov. 3 at the Charles L. Sewall Center. Chappell scored 13 points in the first 10 minutes of action as the Colonials opened the game on a 31-13 run and never trailed in the contest. RMU's biggest lead of the first half came with less than a minute to play when freshman guard Jimmy Langhurst drained a three-pointer to give Robert Morris a 50-27 advantage. The Pioneers closed their deficit to 50-31 at the break on a layup from Jamar Greene and a pair of free throws by Adam Simmons. Chappell scored 15 first-half points on 6-of-10 shooting and also added five rebounds, all offensive. Robert Morris shot an even 50 percent (19-for-38) from the field in the first half as senior forward A.J. Jackson added nine points and junior guard Tony Lee and senior center Freddie Harris each scored six points. In the second half Glenville State pulled to within 17, 53-36, after a threepointer from Greene, but the Colonials used a 20-7 spurt to take a 73-43 lead. The biggest lead of the game for Robert Morris came with 1:54 to play when a layup from freshman forward Dallas Green gave the Colonials a 102-59 advantage. Chappell finished with 25 points on 11-of-15 shooting and added six rebounds and four assists in 24 minutes of work, the most playing time received by a Colonial on the night. Senior guard Derek **Coleman**, who also played 24 minutes, added six points, six rebounds and six assists. Also finishing in double figures scoring for Robert Morris was Jackson and freshman center Bas Rozendaal. Jackson finished with 11 points, while Rozendaal played the final 10 minutes of the contest and scored 12 points on perfect shooting. He finished 3-for-3 from the field and 6-for-6 from the free-throw line with adding a rebound and a block. Also for RMU, Lee contributed seven points, seven rebounds and eight assists in 18 minutes.

Glenville State Game Notes - A total of 13 Colonials received playing time against the Pioneers, with no individual playing more than 24 minutes ... Logging 24 minutes of action were senior guard Derek Coleman and sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell ... The only Colonial not to see action was junior center Aaron Agnew, who has been battling a leg injury much of preseason practice ... Agnew is practicing with the Colonials and is probable for RMU's season opener against Florida International ... Senior Freddie Harris returned to his starting spot at center after missing all but five games of the 2005-06 campaign with a broken foot ... RMU shot 57.7 percent (41-for-71) from the field in the contest, including 66.7 percent (22-for-33) in the second half ... The Colonials received 46 points from their bench ... Freshman center Bas Rozendaal came off the bench to supply 12 points in just 10 minutes of work, finishing 3-for-3 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line ... Robert Morris, which averaged 23.2 shots from beyond the arc in 2005-06, took just 16 shots from behind the three-point line, converting seven (43.8 percent).

Many Happy Returns - A key reason that Robert Morris received its highest preseason ranking in the annual NEC coaches poll (second) is due to the fact that the Colonials return four starters and five letterwinners from a 2005-06 team that posted a scoring average of 73.7 points per game, the highest points per game average offensively by a Mark Schmidt-led club. That total also ranks as the sixth highest scoring average in school history. A year after entering the 2005-06 season having lost 58.9 percent of its scoring from 2004-05, the Colonials have done an about face entering 2006-07. With the return of seniors Derek Coleman, Freddie Harris and A.J. Jackson, juniors Tony Lee and Colson Sénat and sophomore Jeremy Chappell, RMU returns a remarkable 81.6 percent of its scoring and 75.9 percent of its rebounding.

The Lights Get Brighter - Senior forward A.J. Jackson, a virtual unknown entering the 2005-06 season, has been showered with preseason accolades entering the 2006-07 campaign. As well as earning a spot on the 2006-07 preseason All-NEC team after averaging 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game a year ago, Jackson has been named the NEC Preseason Player of the Year by four annual college basketball publications: Athlon Sports, Lindy's College Basketball, Street & Smith's and USAToday Sports Weekly. The latest preseason honor came from Kyle Whelliston of the website midmajority.com, who picked Jackson as one of his nine Mid-Major Stars to Watch for the 2006-07 campaign.

Three For Me, Three for You - One could say that Robert Morris had its most prolific season in school history for three-point shooting in 2005-06, establishing a new school record for team three-point field goals with 260. That total shattered the former school mark of 213, set in 2003-04. Over the course of the club's last 12 games of the 2005-06 campaign, the Colonials averaged 9.8 three-pointers per contest while shooting 40.5 percent (118-for-291) from beyond the arc. Thanks to 11 trifectas @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06), the Colonials broke the single-season school record for three-pointers for the third time in five seasons under head coach Mark Schmidt. RMU's total for three-pointers was the most by an NEC team since Long Island established the league record for three-pointers with 310 in 1997-98.

Road Warrior - One Colonial who was not disappointed in playing away from the friendly confines of the Charles L. Sewall Center in 2005-06 was junior guard Tony Lee. Lee consistently brought his best game to the table for Robert Morris away from home, averaging 13.8 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in 15 road tilts. He was even better on the road against Northeast Conference opponents, averaging 15.9 points and 8.9 caroms in nine league contests while shooting 50.5 percent (51-for-101) from the field. Lee was also one of just two players in the Northeast Conference to finish in the top 15 in four of basketball's top categories: scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. Lee finished 12th in the circuit in scoring (12.6 ppg), sixth in rebounding (7.1 rpg), eighth in assists (3.38 apg) and second in steals (1.89 per game). The other? Fairleigh Dickinson's Chad Timberlake, the 2006 NEC Player of

Stepping In, Stepping Up - One Colonial who seemingly got more comfortable as the season wore on in 2005-06 was junior forward Colson Sénat, who started the last six games of the campaign. As a starter Sénat averaged 6.3 points and 4.2 rebounds while shooting 47.4 percent (9-for-19) from beyond the arc. He was also clutch for the Colonials at the free-throw line in RMU's 67-66 win @ No. 4 seed Mount St. Mary's (3/2/06) in quarterfinal action. After entering the game shooting just 57.1 percent (12-for-21) from the charity stripe on the season, Sénat hit all five of his opportunities in the second half as the Colonials finished a perfect 14-for-14 after halftime.

The Complete Package - While sophomore guard Tony Lee proved to be a key performer for Robert Morris on the road in 2005-06, he quickly proved that there isn't anything to his game that he can't do to help contribute. Lee played some of the best basketball of his young career in the second half of the 2005-06 campaign, evidence of which comes courtesy of his performance in an 89-77 win over Quinnipiac (2/12/06). Against the Bobcats Lee notched his seventh career double-double thanks to 11 points and a career-high 14 rebounds while also adding eight assists in the win for a near triple-double. Lee followed that up by running his streak of double-doubles to three with 14 points and 12 rebounds @ Long Island (2/16/06) and then 14 points and 10 boards @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06). In his last 14 games of the 2005-06 campaign, Lee put it all together, averaging 12.6 points, 7.4 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 1.4 steals per game. Despite a 6'0" frame, Lee enters the 2006-07 with the fourth highest total for career double-doubles in the Northeast Conference with nine. He trails only CCSU's Obie Nwadike (22), fellow teammate and senior forward A.J. Jackson (14) and Mychal Kearse (11) of Mount St. Mary's.

Consistency Breeds Confidence - While some Colonials had up-and-down seasons offensively for Robert Morris in 2005-06, sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell quietly put together a consistent season in his first year in collegiate basketball. The 2006 NEC Rookie of the Year, Chappell led all NEC freshman in scoring (14.1 ppg), rebounding (5.7 rpg) and steals (1.86 per game), totals that ranked 10th, 12th and 3rd, respectively, in the circuit in 2005-06. Despite having his double-figure scoring streak snapped at 14 by scoring eight points in RMU's regular-season finale vs. Mount St. Mary's (2/25/06), Chappell reached the plateau in 21 of his last 23 games. He was even more impressive in the last month of the season, scoring at least 20 points in three of his last five games (18.4 ppg) and averaging 17.1 points per game in RMU's last eight contests.

Streaking - Junior guard Tony Lee had his streak of double figure scoring games snapped at 11 thanks after finishing with nine points @ Fairleigh Dickinson (3/5/06) in the NEC Tournament semifinals. With that streak coming to an end, the longest double-figure streak entering the 2006-07 campaign falls to senior forward A.J. Jackson. Jackson ended the 2005-06 season by scoring in double figures in each of his last nine games, averaging 18.2 points per game over that span. It marked the fourth longest streak of the 2005-06 campaign by a Colonial but one off Jackson's 10-game stretch earlier in the 2005-06 season. A look at the top double-figure scoring streaks by a Colonial as the club begins its 2006-07 campaign:

Freedom - A key reason Robert Morris was able to advance to the 2006 NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in three years was due to the fact that the Colonials came through at the freethrow line in its 67-66 quarterfinal win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/2/06). RMU shot 86.4 percent (19-for-22) on the game, including a perfect 14-for-14 in the second half. It was an about face from the club's previous three games, as RMU shot just 53.7 percent (22-for-41) from the charity stripe in its final trio of regular-season contests. The performance at the free-throw line against the Mount was the club's second best shooting percentage at the charity stripe on the 2005-06 season, trailing only RMU's percentage of 90.5 percent (19-for-21) in a 73-71 win over St. Francis (N.Y.) (1/12/06). Robert Morris also continued its trend of winning games when converting at the free-throw line, as the Colonials were 8-1 when shooting at least 70 percent from the charity stripe in league games. In contrast, the team was just 2-7 when converting under 70 percent.

39 On a Dime - One can point to senior forward **A.J. Jackson** as a key reason the Colonials were able to hang around the upper half of the league standings in 2005-06. Jackson played an integral role for Robert Morris, and one only needs to look at his performance in an 89-77 victory over Quinnipiac (2/12/06) to understand why. Jackson established a careerhigh with 39 points in the win and also added 11 rebounds for his 13th double-double of the season while registering four blocks on the afternoon. To delve deeper into Jackson's impact, consider:

- His 39 points against Quinnipiac established a new Charles L. Sewall Center record for points by an RMU player, eclipsing the 35 former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) scored in a 71-62 win over Sacred Heart (2/5/04)
- The 39 points is also ties the second highest single-game scoring total in school history. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) scored 39 in RMU's season-opening victory @ Missouri-Kansas City (11/22/02)
- His 14 double-doubles on the 2005-06 season is a new single-season school record, breaking the former mark of 10 that was held by Anthony Dickens (1985-90), who accomplished the feat during the 1989-90 campaign
- With 259 rebounds of the year, Jackson posted the most rebounds in a season since Dickens grabbed 271 in 1989-90. Jackson's total ranks third all-time in the single-season annals.

Fantastic Four - A key reason Robert Morris was able to establish a new school record for three-pointers in 2005-06 was due to the club stepping up in Northeast Conference play. The Colonials averaged 9.33 three-pointers per game in league play to lead the circuit, and a number of players came through to help the team lead the league. Junior guard Derek Coleman finished the 2005-06 season as the league's leading three-point shooter against conference foes, converting 45.5 percent (51-for-112) of his shots from long range. Coleman was one of four Colonials in the top 12 individually in three-point field goal shooting against NEC competition. He was joined by senior forward A.J. Jackson (43.9 percent), who tied for third, junior forward Colson Sénat (41.3 percent), who finished eighth, and sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell, who shot 38.8 percent from long range against conference foes to rank 12th.

Round Mound of Rebound - Senior forward A.J. Jackson was as consistent a contributor for Robert Morris in his first season in a Colonial uniform in 2005-06, as he finished the season tied for second in the Northeast Conference in rebounding (9.3 per game). Jackson trailed only Central Connecticut State's Obie Nwadike, who won the rebounding crown with an average of 10.3 caroms per contest, and tied with Wagner's Durrell Vinson (9.3 rpg). Only one Colonial in school history prior to Jackson's campaign in 2005-06 averaged better than 9.0 rebounds per game, when former Colonial Earl Cureton (1976-77) averaged 10.5 caroms a contest in RMU's inaugural Division I campaign in 1976-77. Jackson finishing third in the NEC in rebounding marks the highest showing by a Colonial since 1999-2000, when Steve Pettyjohn (1998-2000) finished second in the circuit (8.4 rpg).

The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career-high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior Derek Coleman enters his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman became just the fifth Colonial in school history to drain at least 70 three-pointers in a season with his 74 in 2005-06, a total that ranks fourth all-time. A quick glance at the top five totals in the Robert Morris single-season record book for three-pointers, and four of those have come under the direction of head coach Mark Schmidt by a total of four different players.

Five Against One - With the addition of seven new players in 2006-07, including four that stand 6'7" or taller, head coach Mark Schmidt will look to build depth on his bench and give his regular starters a breather. In 2005-06, forward's A.J. Jackson and Cori Boston and guards Derek Coleman, Tony Lee and Jeremy Chappell, all regular starters until Boston fell to an injury bug late in the season, combined for an amazing 84.7 percent (1,810-of-2,136) of RMU's offense and 74.5 percent (780-of-1,047) of the club's rebounds.

The Northeast Conference features four schools with duos that combined to score at least 25.0 points per game in 2005-06. Topping the list for the third time in the last four years is Robert Morris, which features senior forward A.J. Jackson and sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell. The duo, led by Jackson's 17.0 ppg average in 2005-06, combined to average 31.1 ppg last season. Chappell averaged 14.1 points per game as a freshman in 2005-06. Entering the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns, Robert Morris had the top returning scoring duo thanks to former forward Chaz McCrommon and former guard Maurice Carter. The top mark by an NEC returning scoring duo was McCrommon and Carter, who averaged 35.5 points game entering 2003-04.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard Derek Coleman, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, also continued to do what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. With a career-high 137 assists on the year, Coleman enters his senior season in 2006-07 with a career total of 288 dimes, which currently ranks 11th all-time at Robert Morris. Coleman has an outside chance of becoming just the sixth Colonial in school history to eclipse 400 career assists, as the last player in school history to turn the trick was former Colonial Javier Smith (1994-98). Smith accumulated 459 assists from 1994-98.

Creating & Creating II - Senior guard Derek Coleman's career-high 137 assists in 2005-06 helped him place his name in the top 10 in the Robert Morris single-season records. Coleman's total ranks tied for the eighth highest single-season total in school history with Andre Boyd (1987-1991), who dished out 137 assists in 1990-91. Coleman also became just the program's third player to lead the Northeast Conference in assists per game. He posted a league-best 4.72 assists per game average in 2005-06 and joined former Colonials Javier Smith (5.4 apg in 1996-97) and Wade Timmerson (6.5 apg in 1991-92) to pace the circuit in assists.

Washington "D.C." - While doing what he does best, senior guard Derek Coleman also became a more accomplished shooter in 2005-06. He finished third in the Northeast Conference in 2005-06 in threepoint field goal shooting percentage (42.3 percent) after entering the year a career 36 percent shooter from beyond the arc. Coleman also finished fourth in the league in free-throw shooting (83.1 per-

Martial Arts - To illustrate the importance of junior guard Tony Lee's presence on defense, one can point to the club's single-game steal totals. Since the start of the 2004-05 campaign, RMU has finished with at least 10 steals in a game 13 times. Over the course of Mark Schmidt's first three seasons as head coach, the Colonials finished with at least 10 steals in a game a total of six times. Lee enters the 2006-07 with 103 career steals, just outside the top 10 all-time. With another solid season this year, Lee could climb into the top 5 all-time at Robert Morris for career steals. Currently ranked fifth is former Colonial Andre Boyd (1987-91), who posted 162 steals over his four-year career.

Double Your Pleasure - Thanks to 15 points and 10 rebounds in a 74-69 setback @ Long Island (2/16/06) last season, senior forward A.J. Jackson notched his Northeast Conference-best 14th double-double of the 2005-06 season. His 14 double-doubles established a new single-season school record, eclipsing the 10 former Colonial Anthony Dickens (1985-90) posted during the 1989-90 campaign. Jackson's 14 double-doubles was also the most by an NEC player since Central Connecticut State's Ron Robinson posted 14 in 2003-04.

Your History Lesson - RMU is the only school ever to jump from junior college to NCAA Division I in the same year (1976), and the Colonials are the NEC record holder for league titles and subsequent NCAA Tournament appearances with five. Robert Morris also is one of two NEC teams to own a victory in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a 64-54 win over Georgia Southern in the 1983 opening round game. RMU has never played in the NIT. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five firstplace votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward A.J. Jackson on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Margues Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of Mark Schmidt during his five years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials rank second in the conference in three-pointers made per game (7.50), behind only St. Francis (N.Y.) (7.55 per game).
