Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team closes out a two-game road trip Wednesday night when it travels across town to the Petersen Events Center for a 7:30 p.m. tilt with Big East opponent Pittsburgh. The Panthers enter the contest ranked second in the latest *Associated Press* poll and third in the latest *USA Today/ESPN* Coaches Poll. The Colonials are coming off a 55-43 victory @ Maine (11/26/06) to run their record to 4-0 for the first time in the program's 31-year history. The win over the Black Bears, coupled with the club's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06), marked the first time RMU garnered back-to-back non-conference road victories since downing Maryland-Baltimore County, 78-76, and defeating American, 64-61, Dec. 4 and Dec. 6, 1993, respectively. Robert Morris returns home to the Charles L. Sewall Center Saturday, Dec. 2, after its game with Pitt, hosting Duquesne for a 7:00 p.m. contest.

Quick Stat of the Night - A key reason that the Colonials are off to their first 4-0 start in the program's 31-year history has been RMU's ability to play solid defense. Through the first four games of the season Robert Morris is allowing an average of **62.0** points per game and an opponent shooting percentage of just **40.7** percent. The Colonials really clamp down after halftime, as in the last two games opponents have converted just **25.5** percent (**14-for-55**) of its shots from the field and **39.8** percent (47-for-118) overall. Robert Morris is off to its best start defensively since holding opponents to an average of 60.0 points per game in the first four contests of the 1986-87 campaign.

Wednesday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - RMU and Pittsburgh will square off for the 26th time Wednesday, with the Panthers having claimed victory in each of the previous 25 meetings. In last year's contest at the Petersen Events Center Pittsburgh garnered an 86-59 victory over Robert Morris (11/23/05) after outscoring the Colonials, 45-24, in the second half.

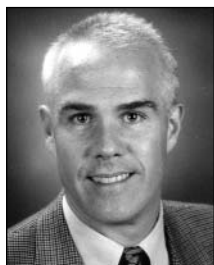

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 69-79 (.466), including a 49-43 (.533) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Panthers - Pittsburgh enters Wednesday's game with the Colonials ranked second in the country in the latest *Associated Press* poll and third in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches Poll and is off to a 6-0 start to the 2006-07 campaign. The Panthers are coming off an 88-66 victory over Florida State (11/24/06) to win the First Commonwealth Colonial Athletic Association championship and in that contest senior forward Antonio Graves led the way with 17 points on 7-of-14 shooting. Pitt is led by senior center Aaron Gray, who is averaging 16.2 points and 9.7 rebounds per contest. Pittsburgh has shot 53.9 percent from the field thus far on the 2006-07 campaign, as Gray has converted 67.7 percent of his shots, junior Mike Cook is shooting 64.4 percent and junior Ronald Roman shoots at a 61.5 percent clip.

Pittsburgh Head Coach - Jamie Dixon (Texas Christian '87) is in his fourth season as head coach at Pittsburgh and fourth season overall. He has guided the Panthers to an overall mark of 82-22 (.788), including a 25-8 overall record in 2005-06.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris notched its fourth straight victory to open the season Nov. 26 with a 55-43 victory at Maine. The victory improves the Colonials to 4-0 to start the 2006-07 campaign, the first time in school history RMU has won four straight to open a season. Robert Morris claimed the victory with a decisive 22-6 run to open the second half. With the Colonials nursing a one-point lead, 32-31, after a pair of free throws from Mark Socoby of the Black Bears, the Colonials got back-to-back three-pointers from senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and a layup from junior guard **Tony Lee** to extend the Colonial advantage to nine, 40-31. Freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** added a three-pointer of his own to push the Colonial lead to double digits, 43-31, and layups from Lee and Jackson helped RMU open its biggest lead of the contest, 48-32, with 8:54 remaining. Maine was able to close its deficit to single-digits on a pair of occasions, both on three-pointers by Jon Sheets, yet each time the Colonials came back with big baskets to help keep the Black Bears at bay. In the first half the two clubs used constant defensive pressure to keep the score down as RMU and Maine went into the break tied, 26-26. Neither team owned a lead of larger than five points in the first half, and that was held by Robert Morris early in the contest as Jackson scored five straight points to open the game. The biggest lead for the Black Bears came when Kevin Reed drained a three-pointer at the 7:35 mark to give Maine an 18-15 lead, but Nwigwe answered Reed's trifecta with a basket of his own to keep Robert Morris close. Reed, Sheets and Junior Bernal combined to shoot just 23.1 percent (9-for-39) from the field for Maine on the game, including 22.7 percent (5-for-22) from beyond the arc. Robert Morris held the Black Bears to a shooting percentage of just 18.5 percent (5-for-27) in the second half and 28.8 percent (17-for-59) on the game, including a paltry 19.2 percent (5-for-26) from beyond the three-point arc. Jackson posted game-high honors in scoring (21) and rebounding (12).

Maine Game Notes - Robert Morris held the Black Bears to a shooting percentage of just 28.8 percent (17-for-59) on the game, including 18.8 percent (5-for-27) in the second half ... Senior guard **Derek Coleman** was held scoreless despite battling a stomach virus and playing all 40 minutes ... Joining Coleman in playing all 40 minutes was senior forward **A.J. Jackson** ... RMU held the edge on the backboard, 47-37, including an 11-10 advantage on the offensive glass ... Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** posted a season high 11 rebounds, marking his third career game with double digit caroms ... The 55 points for Robert Morris was the fewest points for the club in a victory under current head coach **Mark Schmidt** and the fewest points in a win since a 55-52 win @ Central Connecticut State (1/5/97) ... The 43 points is also the lowest amount a Colonial club has surrendered under Schmidt since a 58-43 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) (3/6/04) in the Northeast Conference Tournament quarterfinals.

Four on the Floor - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has gotten off to a great start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. Split Personality - Robert Morris has played two distinct styles of basketball at home in the Charles L. Sewall Center compared to away from home so far in 2006-07. The Colonials enter Wednesday's game @ Pittsburgh shooting 37.8 percent from the floor while averaging 64.0 points per game on the road compared to a shooting percentage of 56.5 percent while averaging 86.5 points per contest at home. On the flipside, the Colonials have played much better defense on the road, allowing an average of 56.0 points per game on a shooting percentage of just 33.9 percent while yielding 68.0 points per contest on a shooting percentage of 48.6 percent at the Sewall Center.

Put Me In Coach - As sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** looks to build depth to his rotation in 2006-07, one player stepping up for the Colonials is sophomore forward **Iffy Ehirim**. Ehirim came off the bench to tie a career high with eight points in a 55-43 win @ Maine (11/26/06) while adding two rebounds, three blocks and two steals in 25 minutes of action. So far on the young season Ehirim has made the most of his playing time, averaging 4.0 points and 2.5 rebounds per contest despite playing an average of 12.5 minutes per game.

Selective Shot - While junior guard **Tony Lee** brings a complete game to the table for Robert Morris, he has been the best marksman for the Colonials in the early portion of the 2006-07 campaign. Lee enters Wednesday's game @ Pittsburgh shooting a team best 60.6 percent (20-for-33) from the field, which ranks third in the Northeast Conference. Over the last three games Lee has shot 63.6 percent (14-for-22) from the field while averaging 11.7 points, 5.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 3.7 steals per contest.

Select Company - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Streaking - Thanks to double-figure scoring games in each of RMU's first four games of the 2006-07 season, senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has extended his double-figure scoring streak to 13 contests dating back to last season. Over that span Jackson is averaging 20.0 points per game and it marks his second streak of at least 10 games scoring in double figures in a Colonial uniform. The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career-high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman, who ranked 19th in Division I last season in three-point field goal percentage (42.3 percent), owns 10 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 151.

Defense Wins Championships - Head coach **Mark Schmidt** has preached over the course of his six years as head coach that a suffocating defense will lead to victories, and his mantra has been proven correct. Under Schmidt, Robert Morris boasts a record of **52-17 (.753)** when holding opponents under 70 points a contest, including 3-0 on the 2006-07 season.

Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris gets its 2006-07 season underway. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel RMU to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

The Lights Get Brighter - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a virtual unknown entering the 2005-06 season, has been showered with preseason accolades entering the 2006-07 campaign. As well as earning a spot on the 2006-07 preseason All-NEC team after averaging 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game a year ago, Jackson has been named the NEC Preseason Player of the Year by five annual college basketball publications: *Athlon Sports*, *Lindy's College Basketball*, *Street & Smith's*, *USA Today Sports Weekly* and *The Sporting News*. The latest preseason honor came from the website midmajority.com, which picked Jackson as one of its nine Mid-Major Stars to Watch for the 2006-07 campaign.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks eighth all-time. A look at where Coleman ranks in career assists:

Creating & Creating II - Senior guard **Derek Coleman's** career-high 137 assists in 2005-06 helped him place his name in the top 10 in the Robert Morris single-season records. Coleman's total ranks tied for the eighth highest single-season total in school history with Andre Boyd (1987-1991), who dished out 137 assists in 1990-91. Coleman also became just the program's third player to lead the Northeast Conference in assists per game. He posted a league-best 4.72 assists per game average in 2005-06 and joined former Colonials Javier Smith (5.4 apg in 1996-97) and Wade Timmerman (6.5 apg in 1991-92) to pace the circuit in assists.

Second Half Surge - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, off to a solid start for Robert Morris this season, has taken a while to warm up in games. Despite averaging a Northeast Conference best 24.0 points per game so far this season, the majority of Jackson's offensive prowess has come after halftime. In the first four games of the campaign Jackson has scored just 22 points in the first 20 minutes of action, yet after the break has scored 74 points. In the second half Jackson has converted **55.8 percent (24-for-43)** of his field goals attempts.

Settling In - With the return of senior center **Freddie Harris** in 2006-07, Robert Morris has the regular starting lineup that head coach **Mark Schmidt** envisioned before Harris went down with a foot injury five games into the 2005-06 campaign. Harris has started with fellow Colonials **A.J. Jackson, Derek Coleman, Tony Lee** and **Jeremy Chappell** just seven times so far, with RMU owning a record of 6-1 in those games.

Three's Company - One could say that Robert Morris had its most prolific season in school history in regard to three-point shooting in 2005-06, establishing a new school record for team three-point field goals with 260. That total shattered the former school mark of 213, set in 2003-04. In 2005-06, the Colonials broke the single-season school record for three-pointers for the third time in five seasons under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. Over the course of the club's last 14 games of the 2005-06 campaign and the first four games of 2006-07 season, the Colonials are averaging **9.6** three-pointers per game while shooting **39.9 percent (172-for-431)** from beyond the arc. In all, Robert Morris has drained at least **10** three-pointers in **12** of its last **18** contests.

Marshall Memorial Classic

Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 43-23 (.652) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 166-104 (.615).

39 On a Dime - One can point to senior forward **A.J. Jackson** as a key reason Robert Morris was able to hang around the upper half of the Northeast Conference standings in 2005-06. Jackson played an integral role for Robert Morris, and one only needs to look at his performance in an 89-77 victory over Quinnipiac (2/12/06) to understand why. Jackson established a career-high with 39 points in the win and also added 11 rebounds for his 13th double-double of the season while registering four blocks on the afternoon. To delve deeper into Jackson's impact, consider:

- His 39 points against Quinnipiac established a new Charles L. Sewall Center record for points by an RMU player, eclipsing the 35 former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) scored in a 71-62 win over Sacred Heart (2/5/04)
- The 39 points is also ties the second highest single-game scoring total in school history. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) scored 39 in RMU's season-opening victory @ Missouri-Kansas City (11/22/02)
- His 14 double-doubles on the 2005-06 season is a new single-season school record, breaking the former mark of 10 that was held by Anthony Dickens (1985-90), who accomplished the feat during the 1989-90 campaign
- With 259 rebounds in 2005-06, Jackson posted the most rebounds in a season since Dickens grabbed 271 in 1989-90. Jackson's total ranks third all-time in the single-season annals.

Round Mound of Rebound - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** was as consistent a contributor for Robert Morris in his first season in a Colonial uniform in 2005-06, as he finished the season tied for second in the Northeast Conference in rebounding (9.3 per game). Jackson trailed only Central Connecticut State's Obie Nwadike, who won the rebounding crown with an average of 10.3 caroms per contest, and tied with Wagner's Durrell Vinson (9.3 rpg). Only one Colonial in school history prior to Jackson's campaign in 2005-06 averaged better than 9.0 rebounds per game, when former Colonial Earl Cureton (1976-77) averaged 10.5 caroms a contest in RMU's inaugural Division I campaign in 1976-77. Jackson finishing third in the NEC in rebounding marks the highest showing by a Colonial since 1999-2000, when Steve Pettyjohn (1998-2000) finished second in the circuit (8.4 rpg).

Your History Lesson - RMU is the only school ever to jump from junior college to NCAA Division I in the same year (1976), and the Colonials are the NEC record holder for league titles and subsequent NCAA Tournament appearances with five. Robert Morris also is one of two NEC teams to own a victory in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a 64-54 win over Georgia Southern in the 1983 opening round game. RMU has never played in the NIT. **2006 Northeast Conference
Preseason Coaches Poll**

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.53), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.41 three-pointers a game.
