Top Story - The **Robert Morris University** men's basketball team closes out a two-game road trip to open its 2006-07 Northeast Conference schedule Saturday afternoon when it travels to Staten Island, N.Y., for a noon contest against Wagner that will televised live on the MSG Network. The Colonials will look to avoid falling into an 0-2 hole in league play for the first time since the 2000-01 campaign and the first time under head coach **Mark Schmidt** against the Seahawks after dropping a 90-74 decision @ Sacred Heart (12/7/06) in its league opener. After Saturday's game RMU will have a week off due to finals and will get back to non-conference play by hosting Youngstown State Saturday, Dec. 16, for a 7:00 p.m. game at the Sewall Center.

Quick Stat of the Night - One distinct trait of Robert Morris under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt has been the club's ability to hit the three-point shot. Since Schmidt was named head coach of the Colonials, RMU has averaged 7.48 three-pointers per game in the last six years, which is tops in the Northeast Conference. However, Robert Morris has struggled in shooting from beyond the arc in recent games, converting just 23.5 percent (20-for-85) of its shots from long range in the last four games. Included in that stretch is a 2-for-22 performance @ Sacred Heart (12/7/06), with the two three-pointers tied for the fewest trifectas hit by a Colonial club in Schmidt's six seasons as head coach.

Saturday's Opponent and the All-Time Series -RMU and Wagner will square off for the 49th

time Saturday, with the Colonials holding a 28-20 lead in the all-time series. Robert Morris has won four of the last six meetings between the two clubs but split the season series in 2005-06, with each team winning on its home court. The Colonials garnered a 95-90 win over the

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 70-81 (.464), including a 49-44 (.527) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Seahawks - Wagner enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 2-6 and its contest with Robert Morris marks the 2006-07 Northeast Conference opener for the Seahawks. Wagner is coming off a 70-44 loss @ Columbia (12/5/06) in its last contest in which the club shot just 35.3 percent from the floor. The Seahawks are led by junior guard Mark Porter, who is averaging 12.2 points, 5.8 rebounds and 4.1 assists per game but is just 5-for-32 from beyond the arc so far this season, a success rate of just 15.6 percent. The top rebounder for the club has been junior forward James Ulrich, who pulls down an average of 6.9 caroms a contest.

Wagner Head Coach - In his fourth season as head coach at Wagner and 23rd season overall is Mike Deane (Potsdam State '74), who owns a career record of 385-272 (.586) entering Saturday's game against Robert Morris. Included in that overall record is a mark of 42-52 (.447) as head coach of the Seahawks. Deane is one of just 28 coaches in NCAA history and one of 13 active coaches to lead three different teams to the NCAA Tournament.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris opened its 2006-07 Northeast Conference schedule with a 90-74 loss to Sacred Heart at the William H. Pitt Center in Fairfield, Conn., Dec. 7. RMU jumped out to a 4-0 lead on a pair of jumpers from senior forward A.J. Jackson, but Sacred Heart was able to keep the game close thanks to its outside shooting. After Jackson's jumpers, Luke Granato hit a three-pointer to pull the Pioneers within one, 4-3. Junior guard Tony Lee hit a pair of free throws to up Robert Morris to a 6-3 advantage, but Granato came back and hit another trifecta to knot the score at six. Sacred Heart then hung a 10-4 run on the Colonials to increase its lead to six, 16-10, as the Pioneers got balanced scoring during the spurt. Liam Potter, Tavio Hobson, Brice Brooks, Jarrid Frye and Drew Shubik each hit baskets during the run for SHU. The Colonials pulled within two, 16-14, thanks to layups from Jackson and Lee, but Chauncy Hardy came off the bench for the Pioneers and drained a three-pointer to give Sacred Heart a 19-14 edge. Robert Morris was able to close its deficit to two, 20-18, after another inside basket from Jackson, but the Pioneers took control with a 20-6 run that was fueled by the long ball. Ryan Litke hit a three-pointer while Hardy hit a pair of his own to help Sacred Heart take its double-digit lead, while Joey Henley and Frye each put home fastbreak dunks during the spurt. Robert Morris was able to close its deficit to 40-29 thanks to five straight points, including four from senior guard Derek Coleman, but SHU eventually entered the break with a 51-34 advantage. Hardy poured in 16 points in the first stanza on perfect 5-for-5 shooting, including 4-for-4 from beyond the arc. In the second half Granato opened the scoring with a three-pointer to push Sacred Heart to a 54-34 advantage, but the Colonials slowly chipped away, cutting their deficit to 14 on three occasions in the first 10 minutes of the half. Each time RMU started to put a run together the Pioneers came up with big baskets, taking their biggest lead of the contest, 73-51, with 9:15 remaining.

The Sacred Heart bench outscored the RMU reserves, 52-14 ... The Colonials shot just 9.1 percent from beyond the arc (2-for-22) ... Senior forward A.J. Jackson, sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell and senior guard Derek Coleman combined to shoot 1-for-14 from three-point range ... SHU posted a 40-34 edge on the backboard, including a 15-14 advantage on the offensive glass ... Freshman forward Dallas Green saw his most significant action of the young season and scored four points in eight minutes ... After playing just four minutes against the Pioneers senior center Freddie Harris has played a total of 24 minutes in the last four contests.

Out of the Groove - Robert Morris will look to get back on track Saturday with regard to its three-point shooting when it squares off with Wagner at the Spiro Sports Center Saturday afternoon. The Colonials are shooting just 23.5 percent (20-for-85) of their shots from long range in the last four games, and a number of individuals have struggled from beyond the arc. Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has shot just 17.4 percent (4-for-23) from long range in the last four games, while sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** has converted at just a 23.5 percent (4-for-17) clip in that same span. However, the one Colonial who has really struggled has been junior forward **Colson Sénat**, who has shot just 14.3 percent (2-for-14) from the three-point line in his last five contests.

Coming Along - One Colonial seemingly finding his niche in the Robert Morris rotation has been freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe**. In the club's Northeast Conference opener @ Sacred Heart (12/7/06) Nwigwe established career highs in points (8) and rebounds (5) in 14 minutes of work while also adding a block and a steal. Nwigwe has fallen prey, much like a lot of Colonials, of poor three-point shooting, as he has converted just two of his 10 attempts so far this season. However, take away his three-point shooting numbers and Nwigwe has proven to have an accurate shooter, converting 55.6 percent (10-for-18) of his shots from inside the arc.

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard **Tony Lee** was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Thanks to his eight steals against Duquesne, Lee moved into the top 10 all-time at RMU for career steals. He enters Saturday's game against Wagner with 125, which ranks eighth.

Selective Shot - While junior guard Tony Lee has been solid on defense in the early going of the 2006-07 campaign, he also has been RMU's most effective shooter. Lee has converted 60.3 percent (38-for-63) of his shots from the field so far this season, which not only leads the club but is tops in the Northeast Conference. What's even more remarkable has been Lee's conversion rate inside the three-point line. Never known as a go-to three-point shooter, Lee has shot just 25 percent (3-for-12) from beyond the arc so far this season. Take those numbers away from his season field goal totals, and Lee is shooting a blistering 68.6 percent (35-for-51) in two-point field goal attempts. Lee enters Saturday's game @ Wagner leading the league in both field goal percentage and steals, averaging 3.17 per game.

Back on Track - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, who had his streak of double figure scoring games dating back to last season snapped at 13 with a season-low six points @ Pittsburgh (11/29/06), got back on track in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06). Jackson finished with 22 points while grabbing nine rebounds against the Dukes, marking the fifth time in the first six games this season Jackson has eclipsed the 20-point plateau. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson is averaging 21.1 points and 10.8 rebounds in 16 games at the Charles L. Sewall Center.

Select Company - Senior forward A.J. Jackson, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Yet Another First - Thanks to the program's best start in school history, Robert Morris entered the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll for the first time Dec. 4, entering the poll at No. 14. The Colonials had the second highest debut in the poll, trailing only Butler, which moved to the No. 1 spot thanks to its perfect 9-0 start. RMU received 241 points to rank 14th in the poll, which encompasses programs from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Continent, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Sun Belt and West Coast. The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career-high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior Derek Coleman entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 threepointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman, who ranked 19th in Division I last season in three-point field goal percentage (42.3 percent), owns 16 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 157.

Defense Wins Championships - Head coach Mark Schmidt has preached over the course of his six years as head coach that a suffocating defense will lead to victories, and his mantra has been proven correct. Under Schmidt, Robert Morris boasts a record of 52-18 (.743) when holding opponents under 70 points a contest, including a perfect mark of 3-0 on the 2006-07 season. A big reason that the Colonials boast a record of 52-18 when holding their opponents under 70 points a game is due to rebounding. When RMU outrebounds its opponent, the club owns a record of 44-14 in the last six years under Schmidt.

Start Me Up - One Colonial who hasn't had his best game yet this season could very well be sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell. After running away with the Northeast Conference Rookie of the Year award in 2006, Chappell got off to a good start to the 2006-07 campaign in looking to avoid the sophomore slump. He hit eight of his 10 shots from the field en route to a 19-point performance in a 96-72 win over Florida International (11/13/06) in RMU's season opener. However, since that contest Chappell has struggle to find his shot, converting just 25 of his 63 field goal attempts, a shooting percentage of 39.7 percent.

Settling In - With the return of senior center Freddie Harris in 2006-07, Robert Morris has the regular starting lineup that head coach Mark Schmidt envisioned before Harris went down with a foot injury five games into the 2005-06 campaign. Harris has started with fellow Colonials A.J. Jackson, Derek Coleman, Tony Lee and Jeremy Chappell just 10 times so far, with RMU owning a record of 7-3 in those games. Freedom - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach Mark Schmidt has been the ability of the team to convert at the freethrow line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. The Colonials have opened their 2006-07 season in style from the charity stripe, converting 71.9 percent (82-for-114) of their shots to rank second in the Northeast Conference. RMU has shot better than 75 percent from the free-throw line in four of its first seven games.

The Lights Get Brighter - Senior forward A.J. Jackson, a virtual unknown entering the 2005-06 season, has been showered with preseason accolades entering the 2006-07 campaign. As well as earning a spot on the 2006-07 preseason All-NEC team after averaging 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game a year ago, Jackson has been named the NEC Preseason Player of the Year by five annual college basketball publications: Athlon Sports, Lindy's College Basketball, Street & Smith's, USA Today Sports Weekly and The Sporting News. The latest preseason honor came from the website midmajority.com, which picked Jackson as one of its nine Mid-Major Stars to Watch for the 2006-07 campaign.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard Derek Coleman, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time.

Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in games. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), senior forward A.J. Jackson and senior guard Derek Coleman each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel RMU to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 Northeast Conference Tournament quarterfinals.

Marshall Memorial Classic

Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach Mark Schmidt, RMU has posted a record of 44-23 (.657) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 167-104 (.616).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward A.J. Jackson has gotten off to a great start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their secondplace preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five firstplace votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.48), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.34 three-pointers a game.
