Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team returns home to the Charles L. Sewall Center Saturday night looking to snap a two-game slide when it hosts Youngstown State for a 7:00 p.m. contest. The Colonials are coming off an 0-2 road trip to start Northeast Conference play, dropping a 90-74 decision @ Sacred Heart (12/7/06) before suffering a 72-60 setback @ Wagner (12/9/06) to close out the trip. RMU closes out its stretch of non-conference games starting Saturday with the Penguins, as the club will also visit Canisius Wednesday, Dec. 20, before hosting Division III Goucher in its final out of league contest Saturday, Dec. 30, at the Sewall Center.

Quick Stat of the Night - Robert Morris will hope that some home cooking Saturday against Youngstown State will cure what ails the club in regard to its shooting woes. Entering play against the Penguins, the Colonials have shot just 39.7 percent (119-for-300) from the field in their last five games. A key reason for the low shooting percentage has been RMU's struggles from beyond the three-point line, as in the same span the club has converted just 24.8 percent (28-for-113) from beyond the arc. Those numbers mark the worst five-game stretch of shooting for a Colonial club under sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** and the worst since converting just 37.3 percent (107-for-287) of its shots from Dec. 9, 2000 to Jan. 2, 2001, and just 19.1 percent (13-for-68) of its shots from beyond the arc from Dec. 28, 2000 to Jan. 13, 2001.

Saturday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - RMU and Youngstown State will tipoff for the eighth time Saturday night, with the Penguins holding a 4-3 edge in the all-time series. The two clubs haven't met since the Colonials garnered an 87-80 win in Youngstown, Ohio, Dec. 19, 2001. That win marked the first non-conference victory for head coach **Mark Schmidt**. In the last meeting between the two clubs at the Charles L. Sewall Center (1/2/01) Youngstown State posted a 69-56 win over Robert Morris.

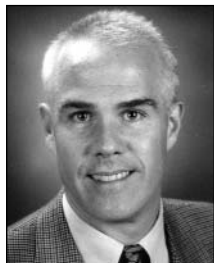

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 70-82 (.461), including a 49-45 (.521) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Penguins - YSU carries an overall record of 4-6 entering Saturday's game against Robert Morris and is coming off a 68-65 win @ UW-Milwaukee (12/10/06) in its last contest. Leading the way for the Penguins has been senior guard Quin Humphrey, who paces the squad in both scoring (17.9 ppg) and rebounding (5.7 rpg). Humphrey is shooting 44.8 percent from the field and also owns 27 assists and 11 steals. Senior guard Keston Roberts adds 15.1 points per game for the Penguins, while junior guard Byron Davis owns a team-best 39 assists and 11 steals.

Youngstown State Head Coach - The 2006-07 campaign marks Jerry Slocum's (The Kings '75) second season as head coach of the Penguins and 32nd overall. He enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 591-352 (.627), including a mark of 11-27 (.289) with YSU. Prior to Youngstown State, Slocum posted a record of 202-81 (.714) in nine years as head coach of Division II Gannon from 1996-2005 after leading NAIA Geneva to a 179-78 (.696) mark in nine seasons from 1987-95.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris dropped back-to-back games for the first time on the 2006-07 season with a 72-60 defeat at Wagner Dec. 9. For the second straight game RMU jumped out to a 4-0 lead, this time as junior guard **Tony Lee** and senior center **Freddie Harris** each hit baskets to give the Colonials the early advantage. It was part of an 11-2 opening run for Robert Morris that also saw Lee add five more points while senior forward **A.J. Jackson** scored on a dunk. Wagner roared back with seven answered points to climb within two, 11-9, but Jackson hit a pair of three pointers to push RMU to a 17-9 lead with 12:55 remaining in the first half. The Colonials held the lead the majority of the first half, but over the last 8:24 of the first stanza the club could muster only two points, with those coming thanks to a pair of free throws from senior guard **Derek Coleman**. Over that span the Seahawks turned a 25-19 deficit into a 34-27 halftime lead as Joey Mundweiler came off the bench to supply Wagner with eight points, including a pair of trifectas. Robert Morris missed its final nine shots from the field in the first half while also committing six turnovers during its drought. In the second half the Colonials again charged out of the gates, scoring the first six points of the half to close within one, 34-33. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** scored the first four points for RMU during the spurt, while Lee converted a fastbreak layup and was fouled during the shot by Wagner's Mark Porter. Lee's free throw shot, however, sat on the front rim motionless before falling away, and RMU couldn't pull even. Jamal Smith then hit a jumper and James Ulrich added a fastbreak layup to push Wagner to a 38-33 lead. RMU climbed within two, 38-36, after another Lee layup and a foul by Smith, with Lee converting the old-fashioned three-point play on the second try. However, each time Robert Morris pulled close, Wagner pulled away. The Seahawks got back to a seven-point edge, 43-36, with 12:53 to go, and the closest RMU would get the rest of the way was five points.

Wagner Game Notes - Robert Morris went the final 8:24 of the first half without a field goal, allowing Wagner to turn a 25-19 deficit into a 34-27 halftime edge ... Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** scored 11 points in the first 10 minutes of the game but scored just two points the rest of the contest ... RMU shot just 28.6 percent (8-for-28) from beyond the arc against the Seahawks and in its two-game road trip to Sacred Heart and Wagner shot just 20 percent (10-for-50) from long range ... For the first time in a Robert Morris uniform Jackson took more three-point field goal attempts (10) than shots from inside the arc (8) ... Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** struggled to a 3-for-12 shooting performance on the afternoon and has converted just one of his last 13 three-point attempts.

Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking, as he enters Saturday's game against Youngstown State having eclipsed the 20-point plateau in each of RMU's first three home games of the season. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 21.1 points and 10.8 rebounds in 16 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard **Tony Lee** was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is tied for the second highest single-game total of the 2006-07 campaign, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell, who posted 10 against UNC Pembroke (11/11/06). Lee also enters Saturday's game against Youngstown State ranked 12th in Division I in steals per game (3.10).

Start Me Up - One Colonial who hasn't had his best game yet this season could very well be sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**. After running away with the Northeast Conference Rookie of the Year award in 2006, Chappell got off to a good start to the 2006-07 campaign in looking to avoid the sophomore slump. He hit eight of his 10 shots from the field en route to a 19-point performance in a 96-72 win over Florida International (11/13/06) in RMU's season opener. However, since that contest Chappell has struggle to find his shot, converting just 28 of his 75 field goal attempts, a shooting percentage of 37.3 percent.

Light My Fire - It's often stated that when one player struggles shooting it can be contagious to other individuals on the team, and that can definitely said about Robert Morris and its three-point shooting. A number of Colonials will look to snap slumps Saturday against Youngstown State. Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has converted just four of his last 26 opportunities from beyond the arc in his last four games, a success rate of just 15.4 percent. Joining Jackson in struggling from beyond the arc has been sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** (one for his last 13) and junior forward **Colson Sénat** (three for his last 17).

Select Company - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Yet Another First - Thanks to the program's best start in school history, Robert Morris entered the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 poll for the first time Dec. 4, entering the poll at No. 14. The Colonials had the second highest debut in the poll, trailing only Butler, which moved to the No. 1 spot thanks to its perfect 9-0 start. RMU received 241 points to rank 14th, which encompasses programs from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Continent, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Sun Belt and West Coast. The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career-high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman, who ranked 19th in Division I last season in three-point field goal percentage (42.3 percent), owns 18 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 159.

Defense Wins Championships - Head coach **Mark Schmidt** has preached over the course of his six years as head coach that a suffocating defense will lead to victories, and his mantra has been proven correct. Under Schmidt, Robert Morris boasts a record of **52-18 (.743)** when holding opponents under 70 points a contest, including a perfect mark of 3-0 on the 2006-07 season. A big reason that the Colonials boast a record of 52-18 when holding their opponents under 70 points a game is due to rebounding. When RMU outrebounds its opponent, the club owns a record of **44-14** in the last six years under Schmidt.

Iron Man - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Saturday's game against Youngstown State having played a full 40 minutes in four of the club's eight games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 27 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.2 minutes per game in 76 starts.

The Substitute - One area of concern for Robert Morris entering the 2006-07 campaign was how head coach **Mark Schmidt** would develop his bench. With seniors **A.J. Jackson** and **Derek Coleman**, junior **Tony Lee** and sophomore **Jeremy Chappell** accounting for almost 75 percent of the club's offensive output last season, that total hasn't changed much in the early portion of this season. The quartet thus far have scored 445 of the club's 561 points, almost 80 percent (79.3) of RMU's total offense. In the first eight games of the 2006-07 campaign the Robert Morris bench has been outscored by its opponents reserves, 169-98. Those totals could be a little skewed thanks to the club's tilt @ Sacred Heart (12/7/06), when the Pioneer bench outscored RMU's, 52-14. Even still, the Colonial backups have outscored their opponents bench just twice in eight games.

Freedom - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach **Mark Schmidt** has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. The Colonials have opened their 2006-07 season in style from the charity stripe, converting 71.5 percent (88-for-123) of their shots to rank second in the Northeast Conference. RMU has shot better than 75 percent from the free-throw line in four of its first eight games.

The Lights Get Brighter - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a virtual unknown entering the 2005-06 season, has been showered with preseason accolades entering the 2006-07 campaign. As well as earning a spot on the 2006-07 preseason All-NEC team after averaging 17.0 points and 9.3 rebounds per game a year ago, Jackson has been named the NEC Preseason Player of the Year by five annual college basketball publications: *Athlon Sports*, *Lindy's College Basketball*, *Street & Smith's*, *USA Today Sports Weekly* and *The Sporting News*. The latest preseason honor came from the website midmajority.com, which picked Jackson as one of its nine Mid-Major Stars to Watch for the 2006-07 campaign.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time.

Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in games. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel RMU to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 Northeast Conference Tournament quarterfinals.

Marshall Memorial Classic

Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 44-23 (.657) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 167-104 (.616).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has gotten off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.48), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.29 three-pointers a game.
