Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team returns home to the Charles L. Sewall Center to open a three-game homestand Saturday with a 2:00 p.m. tilt with Division III Goucher. The Colonials also return to Northeast Conference action during the homestand, hosting Quinnipiac for a 7:00 p.m. contest Thursday, Jan. 4, 2007, before welcoming Central Connecticut State (1/6/07). RMU is coming off an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) in its last contest to improve to 7-1 in games outside of the NEC this season. A victory over Goucher Saturday would settle the club's non-conference record on the 2006-07 campaign at 8-1, which would tie the school record for out of league wins while establishing a new school record for winning percentage (.889) in such games.

Quick Stat of the Night - RMU's shooting woes from beyond the three-point arc in recent weeks has been well documented, yet despite those struggles the Colonials have begun to balance out their offense. Robert Morris enters Saturday's game against Goucher having won back-to-back games thanks to working the ball inside, as in the last two games RMU has outscored its opponent, **80-46**, in points in the paint. In that same span Robert Morris has shot a solid **65.7** percent (46-for-70) inside the arc. In an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06), the Colonials shot **61.2** percent (30-for-49) from the field to establish a new Koessler Athletic Center record for field goal percentage by an opponent and despite RMU's struggles from behind the arc, the club still ranks second in the NEC in field goal percentage (45.6 percent).

Saturday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - Goucher and Robert Morris will square off for the first time in school history Saturday afternoon. The Gophers are the only opponent on RMU's 2006-07 schedule the program hasn't played prior to this season. Goucher marks the sixth opponent either of Division II or Division III classification to play RMU under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, with the Colonials holding a 5-0 record in the previous games.

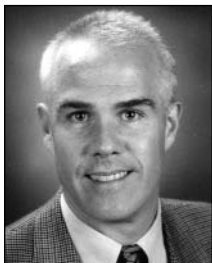

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 72-82 (.468), including a 49-45 (.521) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Gophers - Goucher enters Saturday's game with RMU sporting an overall record of 4-5 and is coming off a 72-64 loss @ Lebanon Valley (12/18/06). Senior guard James Russo paces the Gophers in scoring, pouring in an average of 19.2 points per contest. He also owns 27 of Goucher's 38 three-pointers on the season and has connected on 39.1 percent of his shots from beyond the arc. Senior forward Pierre Jones scores at a 15.1 points per game clip and is the club's leading rebounder, averaging 7.1 caroms a contest. Junior guard Cameron Brown also has proven to be capable of cleaning the glass, as he averages 6.7 rebounds a game while scoring at a 9.4 points per game clip.

Goucher Head Coach - The 2006-07 season marks **Leonard Trevino's** (Texas Tech '87) 17th year on the sidelines for Goucher, and he is the only head coach in the program's history. Trevino has posted an overall record of 226-200 (.531) with the Gophers. For seven seasons from 1993-2000, Trevino helped Goucher post an overall record of 130-60, including three 20-win seasons.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris set a new Koessler Athletic Center record for field goal percentage by an opponent by converting 61.2 percent (30-for-49) of its shots en route to an 81-77 victory over Canisius Dec. 20. RMU opened the game on a 9-2 run thanks to four points from junior guard **Tony Lee**, a layup from senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and a three-pointer from sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**. Senior center **Freddie Harris** would give Robert Morris an 11-3 advantage with a layup in the paint at the 16:19 mark of the first half, and the Colonials were able to keep Canisius at bay thanks to the hot shooting of Jackson. The Griffs closed their deficit to four, 11-7, after a jumper from Frank Turner, but Jackson responded with a three-pointer, then added a layup on an assist from Chappell to get Robert Morris up to a nine-point lead, 16-7. Canisius posted a 13-6 run to knot the score at 22 with 9:51 remaining before halftime. However, sophomore forward **Ifeanyi Ehirim** responded with a layup and Jackson hit his second three-pointer of the game to push the Colonials to a 27-22 advantage. Canisius eventually climbed back to tie the score at 32 thanks to a 10-5 spurt, but again Robert Morris responded, using an 8-2 run to take a 42-32 edge. Freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** scored five points off the bench to spark the Colonials. RMU entered the break with a 44-42 lead and seemed to break the game open in the second stanza by outscoring the Griffs, 10-2, to start the half. The biggest lead of the contest for Robert Morris came with 10:32 remaining when Lee scored a layup to give the Colonials a 62-50 lead. The Golden Griffs made on last gasp, using a 7-1 surge to make it a one possession game, 75-72 in favor of the Colonials, with 1:24 to play. On the ensuing inbounds senior guard **Derek Coleman** was fouled, and he hit both free throws to push RMU to a 77-72 lead with 34 ticks left. A three-pointer by Jovan Robinson made it 77-75 in favor of RMU with 19 seconds to go, but Coleman was again fouled on the inbounds. He promptly sank both free throws with 14 seconds left to help seal the win.

Canisius Game Notes - Robert Morris never trailed against the Golden Griffins thanks to hot starts in both halves ... The Colonials opened the game on an 11-2 spurt and the second half on a 10-2 run ... RMU's shooting percentage of 61.2 percent (30-for-49) established a new Koessler Athletic Center record for an opponent, besting Niagra's mark of 60.9 percent (31-for-51) March 4, 1982 ... RMU posted 21 assists on its 30 field goals as four Colonials finished with at least four dimes in the game ... Robert Morris posted a season high seven blocks in the contest, including a pair each from senior center **Freddie Harris**, sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** and sophomore forward **Ifeanyi Ehirim**.

Mr. Perfect - Junior guard **Tony Lee** certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club is off to just its third 7-3 start in the 31-year history of the program, and he probably was never more valuable in any game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1-for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

Mr. Automatic - Thanks to his perfect evening in an 81-77 win @ Canisius, junior guard **Tony Lee** enters Saturday's game against Goucher leading the Northeast Conference in field goal percentage at 62 percent (62-for-100). Take away his three-point field goal numbers (35 percent) and Lee's field goal shooting percentage in two-point field goals is a blistering 68.8 percent (55-for-80). Entering this season, Lee owned a career shooting percentage of 47.2 percent (210-for-445).

Hard to Imagine - A very important part to senior guard **Derek Coleman's** offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 161 three-pointers on his career, which is tied for fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 38 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

The Strokes - Despite an 0-for-4 performance from beyond the arc in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), it didn't stop **Derek Coleman** from coming through when RMU needed him most. Coleman finished 6-for-6 from the free-throw line against the Golden Griffins, including 4-for-4 in the last 34 seconds to help seal the victory. Coleman owns a free-throw shooting percentage of 89.3 percent (25-for-28) so far this season, which is tops in the Northeast Conference. Coleman could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Saturday's game against Goucher with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 82.5 percent.

Spread The Jam - On of the strength's for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and that has never been more evident than the past two games. In victories over Youngstown State (12/16/06) and @ Canisius (12/20/06), RMU converted a total of 59 field goals, with the club posting assists on 38 of those baskets. That equates to almost 65 percent (64.4) of the club's field goals. In the first four home games on the season, the Colonials have registered an assist on 62.8 percent (76-for-121) of their field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging 16.3 assists per game, which ranks second in the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach **Mark Schmidt** was 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 20 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 161, which ranks tied for fifth all-time at RMU.

Select Company - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 20.3 points and 10.5 rebounds in 17 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. Running With the Devil - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 4-0, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 25-18 (.581) under sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In each of RMU's 10 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

Iron Man - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Wednesday's game @ Canisius having played a full 40 minutes in five of the club's 10 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 27 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.6 minutes per game in 78 starts.

Making It Count - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach **Mark Schmidt** has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials rank second in the circuit in free throw percentage, converting **70.9 percent (117-for-165)** of their opportunities. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting **75.9 percent (41-for-54)** of its shots in the last five minutes of games. Senior guard **Derek Coleman** and senior forward **A.J. Jackson** have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, and they have come through, combining to hit 21 of their 24 opportunities (87.5 percent).

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard **Tony Lee** was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is tied for the third highest single-game total of the 2006-07 campaign, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell, who posted 10 against UNC Pembroke (11/11/06), and Darren Collison of UCLA, who notched nine steals against Long Beach State (11/28/06).

Creating & Creating - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time. Coleman currently is tops in the Northeast Conference in assists per game (5.10) after leading the circuit in 2005-06 with an average of 4.7 per game.

The duo, led by Jackson's 17.0 ppg average in 2005-06, combined to average 31.1 ppg last season. Chappell averaged 14.1 points per game as a freshman in 2005-06. Entering the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns, Robert Morris had the top returning scoring duo thanks to former forward Chaz McCrommon and former guard Maurice Carter. The top mark by an NEC returning scoring duo was McCrommon and Carter, who averaged 35.5 points game entering 2003-04.

Marshall Memorial Classic

Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 45-23 (.662) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 168-104 (.618).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has gotten off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.47), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.26 three-pointers a game.
