Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team, in the midst of a three-game homestand and a three-game winning streak, returns to Northeast Conference play Thursday night when it welcomes Quinnipiac to the Charles L. Sewall Center for a 7:00 p.m. contest. The Colonials are coming off an 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) in their final non-conference game of the 2006-07 campaign and are in search of their first conference victory Thursday night against the Bobcats. RMU opened league play with a two-game road trip, dropping a 90-74 decision @ Sacred Heart (12/7/06) before suffering a 72-60 defeat @ Wagner (12/9/06). RMU will close out its three-game homestand Saturday when it hosts Central Connecticut State.

Quick Stat of the Night - Robert Morris will hope some home cooking will help the club garner its first Northeast Conference victory of the 2006-07 season Thursday night against Quinnipiac. Since the ECAC Metro Conference became the Northeast Conference prior to the 1988-89 campaign, the Colonials are 12-6 (.667) all-time in league home openers, including a mark of 4-1 under head coach Mark Schmidt. The only defeat for RMU in NEC home openers under Schmidt came with an 88-85 loss to Quinnipiac Dec. 4, 2004. The average margin of victory for Robert Morris in home league openers under Schmidt is 5.8 points, including a 95-90 victory over Wagner (1/2/06) in last year's conference home opener.

Thursday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - Robert Morris and Quinnipiac will meet for the 16th time Thursday night, with the Colonials holding a 9-6 edge in the all-time series. RMU enters its game with the Bobcats Thursday winners of three straight and five of the last six in the all-time series. In last year's season series Robert Morris garnered a 90-85 win in

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 73-82 (.471), including a 49-45 (.521) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Bobcats - Quinnipiac enters Thursday's game against RMU with an overall record of 2-9, including 0-2 in Northeast Conference play. The Bobcats have dropped eight straight games since garnering a 71-55 win over Lehigh (11/22/06) and currently are 0-6 on the road. Leading the way offensively has been senior guard Adam Gonzalez, who scores at a 14.4 points per game clip and leads the club in assists with 30. The leading rebounder for Quinnipiac is senior center Victor Akinyanju, who grabs an average of 6.2 caroms per contest. Senior guard Van Crafton, meanwhile, owns 30 of the club's 77 three-pointers and is shooting 39.5 percent from beyond the arc.

Quinnipiac Head Coach - In his 11th season as head coach of Quinnipiac and 11th season overall is Joe DeSantis (Fairfield '79), who owns an overall record of 106-182 (.368) entering Thursday's game. Prior to Quinnipiac, DeSantis had assistant coaching stops at St. John's, Pittsburgh, Duquesne and Fairfield. He was named the 1999-2000 NEC Coach of the Year by CBSsportsline.com after guiding the Bobcats to an overall record of 18-10.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris capped off its best non-conference season in school history Dec. 30 with an 83-38 victory over Division III Goucher. The win improved the Colonials to 8-3 overall on the 2006-07 campaign. RMU's 8-1 record in out-of-league contests ties the school record for non-conference wins, while the .889 winning percentage is a new school record. The 1989-90 Robert Morris club finished its non-conference schedule 8-4. The Colonials jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the first three minutes of action as junior guard **Tony Lee** scored six points. Lee hit his first six shots from the field in the contest before missing a three-pointer with a minute left in the first half. Robert Morris pushed its lead to as many as 31 before the break, 44-13, after a three-pointer from freshman guard Jimmy Langhurst at the 7:20 mark of the first half, but the Colonials scored just three points the rest of half as Goucher closed its halftime deficit to 47-19. In the second half the Colonials opened on a 12-2 spurt to take a 59-21 lead as Lee scored eight points, including six straight to start the stanza. Sophomore Kelvin Bright slammed home a fastbreak dunk on a feed from Lee to give the Colonials a 67-31 lead with 7:59 remaining as RMU got big lifts off the bench from Bright and Langhurst. Bright contributed a career high 13 points while Langhurst added a career high 14 points. Langhurst finished a perfect 4-for-4 from the field, including 2-for-2 from beyond the arc, and 4-for-4 from the freethrow line for his 14 points. Lee led all scorers in the game with a career high 27 points on 10-of-13 shooting from the floor and added five rebounds, three assists and six steals. He was also a perfect 7-for-7 from the free-throw line as the Colonials converted 81.5 percent (22-for-27) of their shots from the charity stripe. The loss for Goucher overshadowed a brilliant performance from guard James Russo, who finished with 24 points on 8-of-15 shooting from the field. Russo drained seven of his 11 three-point field goal attempts, including a pair from well beyond the arc.

Goucher Game Notes - Robert Morris improved to 6-0 under head coach Mark Schmidt in games against Division II or Division III institutions ... The Colonials never trailed in the contest in scoring 44 of the game's first 57 points ... It marked the first double-digit scoring games for freshman guard Jimmy Langhurst (14 pts) and sophomore guard Kelvin Bright (13 pts) ... Junior guard Tony Lee, who entered the game with a season shooting percentage of 45 percent (18-for-40) from the free-throw line, hit all seven of his opportunities from the charity stripe ... Freshman forward Dallas Green tied for game-high honors in rebounds with seven ... The 38 points marked the fewest points in a game in the 17-year history of Goucher basketball ... Robert Morris produced 18 assists on its 28 field goals ... The two clubs tied in rebouunding with 36 each yet the Gophers held a 13-10 edge on the offensive glass ... Senior guard Derek Coleman played 23 minutes but did not score.

Lockdown - As Northeast Conference play returns in earnest this week, Robert Morris will look to continue what its done so far this season in regard to playing defense. The Colonials currently rank second in the NEC in scoring defense, allowing an average of 67.5 points per game. That's just a shade behind Central Connecticut State, which yields an average of 67.4 points per contest to lead the circuit. Entering this season, RMU has allowed an average of 72.0 ppg in five seasons under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. Keeping their opponent under 70 points a game has been beneficial for the Colonials in the Schmidt era, as well, as since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign RMU is 12-2 when holding its opponents under 70 points in a contest.

Straight Shooter - Junior guard Tony Lee hit his first six shots from the field in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) before missing a three-pointer with a minute to go in the first half. With that missed trifecta it ended a streak of 16 straight field goals for Lee dating back to the club's 79-78 win over Youngstown State (12/16/06). Lee hit his last two field goals against the Penguins, all eight of his shots in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) before hitting his first six shots from the floor against the Gophers.

Mr. Automatic - Junior guard Tony Lee has been absolutely on fire from the field in recent weeks, scoring in double figures in each of his last nine games, the longest active streak by a Colonial on the current roster. Over his last nine games Lee is shooting 64.6 percent (64-for-99) from the field and is averaging 17.6 points per game. Lee enters Thursday's game against Quinnipiac leading the Northeast Conference in field goal percentage (63.7 percent) and steals (3.0 per game).

Spread The Jam - On of the strength's for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and that has never been more evident than the past three games. In victories over Youngstown State (12/16/06), Canisius (12/20/06) and Goucher (12/30/06), RMU converted a total of 87 field goals, with the club posting assists on 56 of those baskets. That equates to almost 65 percent (64.4) of the club's field goals. In the first five home games on the season, the Colonials have registered an assist on 63.1 percent (94-for-149) of their field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging 16.45 assists per game, which leads the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach Mark Schmidt was 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

Put Me In Coach - As head coach Mark Schmidt tries to extend his bench in 2006-07, one of the most positive developments in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) was the contributions from guards Jimmy Langhurst and Kelvin Bright. While junior guard Tony Lee produced a career high 27 points in the win, Langhurst and Bright were the only other Colonials to finish in double figures scoring. Langhurst finished with 14 points in 14 minutes, while Bright contributed 13 points in 20 minutes of action. The pair could be important for Robert Morris as the club heads into the bulk of its Northeast Conference schedule. Entering the game with Goucher, Langhurst had played just 20 minutes in six games, while Bright had given RMU just 10 minutes in three games.

Mr. Perfect - Junior guard Tony Lee certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club is off toan 8-3 start to the 2006-07 season, and he probably was never more valuable in any game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1-for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

The Encore - While junior guard Tony Lee nailed all eight of his shots from the field in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06), freshman guard Jimmy Langhurst provided the encore in an 83-38 win over Division III Goucher (12/30/06). Langhurst hit all four of his shots from the field, including two from long range, and sank all four of his free-throw opportunities in producing a career high 14 points and finishing second on the club in scoring against the Gophers. Possibly the purest shooter on the club, Langhurst has hit on 66.7 percent (6-of-9) of his shots this season, including three of his four opportunites from downtown.

Paint by Numbers - RMU's shooting woes from beyond the three-point arc in recent weeks has been well documented, yet despite those struggles the Colonials have begun to balance out their offense. Robert Morris looks for its fourth straight win Thursday against Quinnipiac having outscored its opponent, 118-54, in points in the paint in its last three games. As a whole RMU has done a more than adequate job of working the ball inside so far in 2006-07, averaging 32.7 points in the paint this season and outscoring their opponent in the category in eight of its first 11 tilts. Take away the three-point shooting by the Colonials in 2006-07 (31.8 percent) and Robert Morris is shooting 54 percent (220-for-407) in two-point field goals.

Hard to Imagine - A very important part to senior guard Derek Coleman's offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 161 three-pointers on his career, which is tied for fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 38 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

The Strokes - Despite an 0-for-4 performance from beyond the arc in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), it didn't stop Derek Coleman from coming through when RMU needed him most. Coleman finished 6-for-6 from the free-throw line against the Golden Griffins, including 4-for-4 in the last 34 seconds to help seal the victory. Coleman owns a free-throw shooting percentage of 89.3 percent (25-for-28) so far this season, which is tops in the Northeast Conference. Coleman could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Thursday's game against Quinnipiac with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 82.5 percent.

Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris gets its 2006-07 season underway. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), senior forward A.J. Jackson and senior guard Derek Coleman each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel RMU to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior Derek Coleman entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 20 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 161, which ranks tied for fifth all-time at RMU. With 16 regular-season games remaining in 2006-07, Coleman needs 58 three-pointers to eclipse the record of 218 held by Thomas. Over that span Coleman will need to average 3.6 three-pointers per game.

Select Company - Senior forward A.J. Jackson, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward A.J. Jackson has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 20.3 points and 10.3 rebounds in 18 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. Running With the Devil - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 4-0, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 25-18 (.581) under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In each of RMU's 11 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

Iron Man - Senior guard Derek Coleman doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Thursday's game against Quinnipiac having played a full 40 minutes in five of the club's 11 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 28 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.1 minutes per game in 79 starts.

Making It Count - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach Mark Schmidt has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials rank second in the circuit in free throw percentage, converting 72.4 percent (139-for-192) of their opportunites. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting 77.2 percent (51-for-66) of its shots in the last five minutes of games. Senior guard Derek Coleman and senior forward A.J. Jackson have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, and they have come through, combining to hit 21 of their 24 opportunities (87.5 percent).

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard Tony Lee was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is tied for the third highest single-game total of the 2006-07 campaign, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell, who posted 10 against UNC Pembroke (11/11/06), and Darren Collison of UCLA, who notched nine steals against Long Beach State (11/28/06).

Creating & Creating - Senior guard Derek Coleman, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time. Coleman currently ranks second in the Northeast Conference in assists per game (5.00) after leading the circuit in 2005-06 with an average of 4.7 per game.

Topping the list for the third time in the last four years is Robert Morris, which features senior forward A.J. Jackson and sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell. The duo, led by Jackson's 17.0 ppg average in 2005-06, combined to average 31.1 ppg last season. Chappell averaged 14.1 points per game as a freshman in 2005-06. Entering the 2003-04 and 2004-05 campaigns, Robert Morris had the top returning scoring duo thanks to former forward Chaz McCrommon and former guard Maurice Carter. The top mark by an NEC returning scoring duo was McCrommon and Carter, who averaged 35.5 points game entering 2003-04.

Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach Mark Schmidt, RMU has posted a record of 46-23 (.667) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 169-104 (.619).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward A.J. Jackson got off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward A.J. Jackson on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of Mark Schmidt during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.45), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.26 three-pointers a game.
