**Top Story** - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team closes out a three-game home-stand Saturday night by welcoming Central Connecticut State to the Charles L. Sewall Center for a 7:00 p.m. Northeast Conference game. Thanks to an 86-68 win over Quinnipiac (1/4/07) in their 2006-07 league home opener, the Colonials enter the game riding a four-game winning streak. It marks the second four-game winning streak of the season for RMU, as the club also won its first four contests of the season before suffering a 67-53 defeat at then No. 2 Pittsburgh (11/29/06). Robert Morris takes to the road after Saturday's game with CCSU, visiting Long Island (1/11/07) and Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07) in a two-game road swing.

**Quick Stat of the Night** - Junior guard **Tony Lee** just seems to get better and better each time he takes the court. He paced Robert Morris in its 86-68 win over Quinnipiac (1/4/07) with 20 points while adding five rebounds, five assists and six steals and now has scored in double figures in 10 straight games. By averaging a solid 19.7 points in his last seven contests, Lee enters Saturday's tilt as RMU's leading scorer thanks to a 16.3 points per game average. It marks the first time someone other than senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has been RMU's leading scorer since the club entered its game @ Pitt (11/23/05), when former forward Cori Boston was averaging 16.0 ppg, a stretch of 39 games.

**Saturday's Opponent and the All-Time Series** - Central Connecticut State and Robert Morris will meet for the 20th time Saturday night, with the Blue Devils holding a 10-9 advantage in the all-time series. The Colonials won the only meeting between the two clubs last season, garnering a 77-74 win at the Charles L. Sewall Center Feb. 10, 2006. In that contest sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** led five players in double figures scoring with 19 points on 7-of-14 shooting. Saturday's game marks the third straight in the all-time between CCSU and RMU at the Sewall Center, with Robert Morris victorious in the previous two.

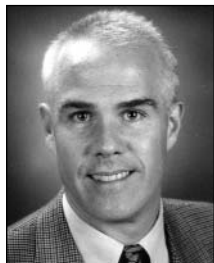

## Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 74-82 (.474), including a 50-45 (.526) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

**Scouting the Blue Devils** - Central Connecticut State enters Saturday's game with RMU sporting an overall record of 5-9, including 2-0 in Northeast Conference play. The Blue Devils are coming off an 80-61 victory @ Saint Francis (Pa.) (1/4/07) in which junior guard Tristan Blackwood scored 28 points while senior guard Javier Mojica added 27 points. Blackwood has scored 54 points in CCSU's first two league games, while Mojica has poured in 49 points in the same span. Mojica is the club's leading scorer and ranks second in the NEC with a 17.1 points per game average, while senior forward Obie Nwadike leads the NEC in rebounding with an average of 10.1 per game.

**Central Connecticut State Head Coach** - The 2006-07 campaign is the 11th season for **Howie Dickenman (Central Connecticut State '70)** as head coach of the Blue Devils, and he enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 161-142 (.531). A model of consistency in the NEC, Dickenman and the Blue Devils have appeared in four of the last eight NEC championship games.

**RMU's Last Game** - Robert Morris held Quinnipiac without a field goal in the first six minutes of the second half and turned a 41-38 halftime edge into a 20-point lead in cruising to an 86-68 win over the Bobcats Jan. 4. Up three at the break Robert Morris scored the first 18 points of the second half to seal the victory as the club got balanced scoring during its run. Junior guard **Tony Lee** contributed six points during the spurt, while senior center **Freddie Harris** scored four points. The Bobcats missed their first seven shots from the field to start the second half while committing five turnovers as the Colonials built their big lead. Adam Gonzalez snapped the streak for Quinnipiac with a jumper to make it 59-40 in favor of RMU with 13:23 remaining, but the Colonials pushed their lead to as many as 27 in the second half en route to the win. Robert Morris jumped out of the gates to a 19-10 lead on the strength of shooting from sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, who scored seven points in the opening salvo. Despite the nine-point advantage the Bobcats clawed back to tie the score at 19 as DeMario Anderson scored four points and Casey Cosgrove hit a three-pointer. Chappell would break the tie with a jumper on a fastbreak and RMU eventually opened up a 25-19 advantage, but an 11-2 run by Quinnipiac gave the Bobcats a 30-27 lead with 5:22 left before the break. Anderson scored five points during the surge, while Chris Wehye added a dunk. Junior forward **Colson Sénat** came off the bench and hit a three-pointer to tie the score at 30 and added another trifecta to give RMU the lead for good, 33-30, with 4:38 to go before halftime. Lee scored 20 points and added six rebounds, five assists and six steals to pace the Colonials, while Chappell added 18 points, senior guard **Derek Coleman** 13 and Harris 12. Coleman also notched his second career double-double thanks to a career high 11 assists. Sénat finished with eight points and four rebounds in 18 minutes of action, while Harris tallied a career high seven rebounds in the victory.

**Quinnipiac Game Notes** - Robert Morris again dominated in points in the paint, outscoring Quinnipiac, 42-22, in the category ... The win gave the Colonials back-to-back palindromic victories ... RMU beat Goucher, 83-38, Dec. 30, 2006 ... Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** battled foul trouble and finished with just six points and four rebounds ... The Colonials outrebounded the Bobcats, 37-32 ... To show the balance RMU posted on the glass, an amazing seven Colonials finished with at least four rebounds in the game ... Thanks to a 41-38 halftime lead and going on to victory Robert Morris improved to 6-0 when leading at the break ... Junior guard **Tony Lee** hit seven of his eight free-throw attempts and is now 14-for-15 in the last two games after starting the season 18-for-40 (45 percent) ... Robert Morris hit 20 of its 25 free throw attempts while Quinnipiac visited the free-throw line just 12 times, converting eight.

**Buddy Lee** - Junior guard **Tony Lee**, who owns a streak of 10 straight double figure scoring games, has also put together a similar streak in regard to games at the Charles L. Sewall Center. Dating back to the 2005-06 campaign, Lee has scored in double figures in 11 straight home games, averaging 16.2 points per contest. Over that same span Lee has shot an even 60 percent (66-for-110) from the field and has also picked up other areas of his game, averaging 6.5 rebounds, 4.6 assists and 3.1 steals per tilt.

**On A Roll** - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** notched his second career double double in RMU's Northeast Conference home opener against Quinnipiac (1/4/07), scoring 13 points and dishing out a career high 11 assists. In the first three league games of the 2006-07 campaign Coleman has done a solid job of creating offense, averaging 8.3 assists per contest that leads the circuit. Even with his success distributing the ball, Coleman is in the midst of his best stretch shooting from the free-throw line. Entering Saturday's game against Central Connecticut State Coleman has converted each of his last 17 opportunities at the charity stripe in his last five games. On the season Coleman leads the NEC in free-throw percentage at 90.6 percent.

**Lockdown** - As Northeast Conference play returns in earnest this week, Robert Morris will look to continue what its done so far this season in regard to playing defense. The Colonials currently rank third in the NEC in scoring defense, allowing an average of 67.5 points per game. That's just a shade behind Central Connecticut State and Monmouth, which each yield an average of 66.9 points per contest to lead the circuit. Entering this season, RMU has allowed an average of 72.0 ppg in five seasons under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. Keeping their opponent under 70 points a game has been beneficial for the Colonials in the Schmidt era, as well, as since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign RMU is 13-2 when holding its opponents under 70 points in a contest.

**Straight Shooter** - Junior guard **Tony Lee** hit his first six shots from the field in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) before missing a three-pointer with a minute to go in the first half. With that missed trifecta it ended a streak of 16 straight field goals for Lee dating back to the club's 79-78 win over Youngstown State (12/16/06). Lee hit his last two field goals against the Penguins, all eight of his shots in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) before hitting his first six shots from the floor against the Gophers.

**Spread The Jam** - One of the strength's for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and that has never been more evident than the past four games. In victories over Youngstown State (12/16/06), Canisius (12/20/06), Goucher (12/30/06) and Quinnipiac (1/4/07), RMU converted a total of 117 field goals, with the club posting assists on 72 of those baskets. That equates to over 60 percent (61.5) of the club's field goals. In the first six home games on the season, the Colonials have registered an assist on 61.4 percent (110-for-179) of their field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging **16.42** assists per game, which **leads** the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach **Mark Schmidt** was 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

**Mr. Perfect** - Junior guard **Tony Lee** certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club is off to a 9-3 start to the 2006-07 season, and he probably was never more valuable in any game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1-for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

**The Encore** - While junior guard **Tony Lee** nailed all eight of his shots from the field in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06), freshman guard **Jimmy Langhurst** provided the encore in an 83-38 win over Division III Goucher (12/30/06). Langhurst hit all four of his shots from the field, including two from long range, and sank all four of his free-throw opportunities in producing a career high 14 points and finishing second on the club in scoring against the Gophers. Possibly the purest shooter on the club, Langhurst has hit on 66.7 percent (6-of-9) of his shots this season, including three of his four opportunities from downtown.

**Paint by Numbers** - RMU's shooting woes from beyond the three-point arc in recent weeks has been well documented, yet despite those struggles the Colonials have begun to balance out their offense. Robert Morris looks for its fifth straight win Saturday against Central Connecticut State having outscored its opponent, **160-76**, in points in the paint in its last four games. As a whole RMU has done a more than adequate job of working the ball inside so far in 2006-07, averaging 33.5 points in the paint this season and outscoring their opponent in the category in nine of its first 12 tilts. Take away the three-point shooting by the Colonials in 2006-07 (31.8 percent) and Robert Morris is shooting 54.1 percent (244-for-451) in two-point field goals.

**Hard to Imagine** - A very important part to senior guard **Derek Coleman's** offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 161 three-pointers on his career, which is tied for fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 39 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

**The Strokes** - Despite an 0-for-4 performance from beyond the arc in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), it didn't stop **Derek Coleman** from coming through when RMU needed him most. Coleman finished 6-for-6 from the free-throw line against the Golden Griffins, including 4-for-4 in the last 34 seconds to help seal the victory. Coleman owns a free-throw shooting percentage of 90.6 percent (29-for-32) so far this season, which is tops in the Northeast Conference. Coleman could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Thursday's game against Quinnipiac with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 85.4 percent.

**Clutch Shooting** - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris gets its 2006-07 season underway. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06), senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel RMU to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

**The Chase Is On** - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 21 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 162, which ranks fifth all-time at RMU. With 15 regular-season games remaining in 2006-07, Coleman needs 57 three-pointers to eclipse the record of 218 held by Thomas. Over that span Coleman will need to average 3.8 three-pointers per game.

**Select Company** - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. **Home Is Where the Heart Is** - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 18.7 points and 10.0 rebounds in 19 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. **Running With the Devil** - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 4-0, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 25-18 (.581) under sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In each of RMU's 12 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

**Iron Man** - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Thursday's game against Quinnipiac having played a full 40 minutes in five of the club's 11 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 28 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.3 minutes per game in 80 starts.

**Making It Count** - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach **Mark Schmidt** has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials rank second in the circuit in free throw percentage, converting 73.3 percent (159-for-217) of their opportunities. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting 78.6 percent (55-for-70) of its shots in the last five minutes of games. Senior guard **Derek Coleman** and senior forward **A.J. Jackson** have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, and they have come through, combining to hit 23 of their 26 opportunities (88.5 percent).

**Pop Goes the Weasel** - Junior guard **Tony Lee** was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is tied for the third highest single-game total of the 2006-07 campaign, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell, who posted 10 against UNC Pembroke (11/11/06), and Darren Collison of UCLA, who notched nine steals against Long Beach State (11/28/06).

**Creating & Creating** - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has gotten off to a good start this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time. Coleman currently ranks second in the Northeast Conference in assists per game (5.00) after leading the circuit in 2005-06 with an average of 4.7 per game.

# Marshall Memorial Classic

**Home Sweet Home** - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 47-23 (.671) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 170-104 (.620).

**Four on the Floor** - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** got off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. ### 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

## The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.44), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.26 three-pointers a game.
