Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team, riding a season high five-game winning streak, starts a two-game road trip Thursday when it travels to Brooklyn, N.Y., for a 7:00 p.m. contest @ Long Island. The Colonials are coming off a 64-48 victory over Central Connecticut State (1/6/07) to help even their NEC record at 2-2 and complete a perfect 3-0 homestand. RMU will also travel to Teaneck, N.J, for a 7:00 p.m. contest @ Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07) during its swing. Thanks to its 10th win against CCSU, Robert Morris established a new NEC record while tying a school record for fastest to 10 wins. The 1988-89 Colonials also started 10-3 en route to an overall record of 21-9 and a spot in the 1989 NCAA Tournament.

Quick Stat of the Night - Robert Morris enters Thursday's game riding a season high five-game winning streak based in large part to its defense. In the last five games, opponents have shot just 40.7 percent (112-for-275) from the field in averaging 61.8 points per contest. Including RMU's current five-game winning streak the Colonials are in the midst of, the club has posted winning streaks of at least five games a total of 14 times in school history. By yielding an average of 61.8 points per game during the winning streak, it marks the second best defensive effort by the Colonials during a winning streak. In 1999-2000, Robert Morris allowed an average of 61.0 points per game in winning five straight from Feb. 5, 2000, to Feb. 17, 2000.

Thursday's Opponent and the All-Time Series-Robert Morris and Long Island will square off for the 54th time Thursday night, with the Colonials holding a 30-23 edge in the all-time series. The two clubs split the season series in 2005-06, with each team garnering victory on its home court. Robert Morris downed the Blackbirds, 70-66, at the Charles L. Sewall

# Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks Mark Schmidt's sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 75-82 (.478), including a 51-45 (.531) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Blackbirds - Long Island enters Thursday's game against Robert Morris with an overall record of 5-9, including a 1-2 mark in the Northeast Conference. The Blackbirds are coming off a 68-52 loss to St. Francis (N.Y.) and own a record of 10-4 in the Wellness, Recreation and Athletic Center, which opened in January of 2006. LIU has been led by senior guard James Williams, who ranks second in the NEC in scoring (16.1 ppg). The leading rebounder for Long Island is senior guard Aubin Scott, who pulls down an average of 7.9 caroms a contest.

Long Island Head Coach - In his fifth season on the sidelines for the Blackbirds is Jim Ferry (Keene State '90), who owns an overall record of 152-97 (.610), including a record of 48-78 (.381) with Long Island. Prior to his stint with LIU, Ferry spent three seasons at Division II Adelphi University, where he guided the Panthers to an overall record of 82-11.

RMU's Last Game - Robert Morris remained perfect at home in the Charles L. Sewall Center and held Central Connecticut State to a shooting percentage of just 36.4 percent (16-for-44) en route to a 64-48 win over the Blue Devils Jan. 6. The Blue Devils hit their first four shots from the field, including three-pointers from Tristan Blackwood and Joe Seymore, to build an early 10-4 advantage three and-a-half minutes into the contest, but after that Central Connecticut State converted just 12 of its final 40 shots from the field as the RMU defense clamped down. Robert Morris took a 15-14 lead after a layup from junior guard Tony Lee with 13:12 to go before halftime, but Obie Nwadike answered with a layup of his own to push the Blue Devils back in front, 16-15. The see-saw battle continued until Robert Morris hung a 9-1 run on CCSU to take a 29-22 lead and eventually entered the break with a 29-24 advantage. During the spurt freshman guard Mezie Nwigwe came off the bench to hit a three-pointer, while Lee hit a pair of free throws and senior forward A.J. Jackson added a jumper. In the first five minutes of the second half RMU held Central Connecticut State to just 1-for-5 shooting and in the process stretched its five-point halftime lead into a 12-point advantage, 41-29, with 15:07 to play. Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell scored five points during the run, while Jackson added a three-pointer. Chappell's jumper in the paint with 12:03 remaining gave Robert Morris its biggest lead of the game, 46-31, and the Blue Devils could whittle their deficit to single digits just once the rest of the game. Blackwood hit a pair from the charity stripe to make it 52-44 in favor of RMU with 6:18 to go. Senior guard Derek Coleman answered with a layup to push the Colonial lead back to double digits, 54-44, and Chappell's three-pointer from the corner with 3:22 helped seal the victory by giving RMU a 59-46 edge. Chappell scored 16 points on 7-of-11 shooting to pace all scorers and added eight rebounds, while Jackson recorded his 18th career double-double thanks to 13 points and 10 boards. He also added a career high three steals. Lee added 12 points, seven rebounds, three assists and four steals, while Coleman chipped in with 10 points and six assists.

Central Connecticut State Game Notes - Robert Morris dominated on the glass against the Blue Devils, outrebounding CCSU by 20 (39-19) ... The Colonials also held a 13-9 edge on the offensive glass ... Guards Tristan Blackwood and Javier Mojica, who scored a combined 103 points in CCSU's first two NEC games, were held to a combined 15 points ... Blackwood finished just 1-for-9 from the field, including 1-of-7 from beyond the arc ... Blue Devil forward Obie Nwadike, who had 17 rebounds two nights prior in a win @ Saint Francis (Pa.) (1/4/07), grabbed just five rebounds ... Jeremy Chappell led RMU with 16 points, the first time in 13 games this season the sophomore guard has paced the Colonials in scoring ... RMU shot 45 percent (9-for-20) from beyond the arc, the first time in 10 games the club shot better than 40 percent from long range.

Center of Attention - While a lot of attention is paid to RMU's "Big Four" in regard to scoring, the Colonials wouldn't be carrying a five-game winning streak into their game Thursday @ Long Island without the contributions from senior center Freddie Harris. In the last five games Harris has become a bigger factor for Robert Morris, averaging 7.6 points and 3.6 rebounds in just over a shade of 20 minutes of work (20.2 minutes per contest). Even more impressive has been the shooting touch employed by Harris. In the last five games Harris is shooting a spectacular 70 percent (14-for-20) from the field.

The Anatomy of a Five-Game Winning Streak - Robert Morris takes a five-game winning streak into its game Thursday @ Long Island, which ties the longest streak for the Colonials under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt. A look at some statistical numbers to show how RMU has reached its streak ... Robert Morris has shot 52 percent (142-for-273) from the field while holding its opponents to a shooting percentage of 40.7 percent (112-for-275) ... The Colonials own a rebounding margin of +5.0 during their winning streak, averaging 35.0 rebounds a game while yielding an average of 30.0 per contest ... RMU has converted 73.8 percent (76-for-103) of its free throws while its opponents have shot just 68.4 percent (54-for-79).

Stingy - If Robert Morris is to extend its winning streak any farther than five games when it takes its show on the road this week for games @ Long Island (1/11/07) and Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07), the defensive intensity will have to continue. The Colonials enter Thursday's game against the Blackbirds currently leading the NEC in scoring defense, allowing an average of 66.0 points per game. That's just a shade ahead of Monmouth, which yields an average of 66.2 points per contest. Entering this season, RMU allowed an average of 72.0 ppg in five seasons under head coach Mark Schmidt. Keeping their opponent under 70 points a game has been beneficial for the Colonials in the Schmidt era, as well, as since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign RMU is 14-3 when holding its opponents under 70 points in a contest.

On A Roll - Senior guard Derek Coleman notched his second career double double in RMU's Northeast Conference home opener against Quinnipiac (1/4/07), scoring 13 points and dishing out a career high 11 assists. In the first four league games of the 2006-07 campaign Coleman has done a solid job of creating offense, averaging 7.8 assists per contest, which leads the circuit. Even with his success distributing the ball, Coleman is in the midst of his best stretch shooting from the free-throw line. Entering Thursday's tilt @ Long Island Coleman has converted each of his last 17 opportunities at the charity stripe in his last six games. On the season Coleman leads the NEC in free-throw percentage at 90.6 percent.

Spread The Jam - One of the strength's for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and that has never been more evident than the during RMU's five-game winning streak. In the last five contests RMU has converted a total of 142 field goals, with the club posting assists on 87 of those baskets. That equates to over 60 percent (61.3) of the club's field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging 16.31 assists per game, which leads the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach Mark Schmidt is 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

Both Ends of the Floor - Junior guard Tony Lee has been the most complete player for Robert Morris in the first half of the 2006-07 season, and the evidence is in the numbers. Offensively, Lee leads the Colonials in scoring (16.0 ppg) while pacing the Northeast Conference in field goal percentage (.631). Defensively, Lee also leads the circuit in steals by averaging 3.31 per game. In the national rankings, Lee enters this week's play ranked fourth in Division I in steals, while his field goal percentage ranks 17th. A look at the numbers ...

Paint by Numbers - RMU's shooting woes from beyond the three-point arc in recent weeks has been well documented, yet despite those struggles the Colonials have begun to balance out their offense. Robert Morris looks for its sixth straight win Thursday @ Long Island having outscored its opponent, 182-98, in points in the paint in its last five games. As a whole RMU has done a more than adequate job of working the ball inside so far in 2006-07, averaging 33.2 points in the paint this season and outscoring their opponent in the category in nine of its first 13 tilts. Take away the three-point shooting by the Colonials in 2006-07 (32.7 percent) and Robert Morris is shooting 54.3 percent (260-for-479) in twopoint field goals.

Mr. Perfect - Junior guard Tony Lee certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club is off to a 10-3 start to the 2006-07 season, and he probably was never more valuable in a game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

The Encore - While junior guard Tony Lee nailed all eight of his shots from the field in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06), freshman guard Jimmy Langhurst provided the encore in an 83-38 win over Division III Goucher (12/30/06). Langhurst hit all four of his shots from the field, including two from long range, and sank all four of his free-throw opportunities in producing a career high 14 points and finishing second on the club in scoring against the Gophers. Possibly the purest shooter on the club, Langhurst has hit on 66.7 percent (6-of-9) of his shots this season, including three of his four opportunities from downtown.

Straight Shooter - Junior guard Tony Lee hit his first six shots from the field in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) before missing a three-pointer with a minute to go in the first half. With that missed trifecta it ended a streak of 16 straight field goals for Lee dating back to the club's 79-78 win over Youngstown State (12/16/06). Lee hit his last two field goals against the Penguins, all eight of his shots in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) before hitting his first six shots from the floor against the Gophers.

Road Warrior - While junior guard Tony Lee has been as consistent a player as any for Robert Morris this season, he seems to raise his game when the Colonials go on the road. Lee seems to love playing away from the Charles L. Sewall Center, as so far this season he has shot a solid 60.4 percent (32-for-53) from the field in averaging 13.0 points per game. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Lee has scored in double figures in 18 of his last 21 road games and over that span is averaging 13.6 points, 7.2 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.8 steals per game while shooting 48.8 percent (103-for-211).

Did You Know? RMU's +34 scoring margin in its victories over Quinnipiac (1/4/07) and Central Connecticut State (1/6/07) is the best such mark by a Robert Morris club under head coach Mark Schmidt. The previous best was a +32 scoring margin in wins over St. Francis (N.Y.) (93-80; 1/10/02) and Long Island (85-66; 1/12/02) in Schmidt's first year as head coach in 2001-02.

Hard to Imagine - A very important part to senior guard Derek Coleman's offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 164 three-pointers on his career, which ranks fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 40 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

The Strokes - Despite an 0-for-4 performance from beyond the arc in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), it didn't stop Derek Coleman from coming through when RMU needed him most. Coleman finished 6-for-6 from the free-throw line against the Golden Griffins, including 4-for-4 in the last 34 seconds to help seal the victory. Coleman owns a free-throw shooting percentage of 90.6 percent (29-for-32) so far this season, which is tops in the Northeast Conference. Coleman could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Thursday's game @ Long Island with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 85.4 percent.

Select Company - Senior forward A.J. Jackson, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris enters the second half of the 2006-07 campaign. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06) in the club's first road game of the season, senior forward A.J. Jackson and senior guard Derek Coleman each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel the Colonials to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

RMU Weekly Honors - Senior forward A.J. Jackson (Northeast Conference Choice Hotels Player of the Week - 11/20/06) ... Senior forward A.J. Jackson (NEC Choice Hotels Player of the Week - 11/27/06) ... Junior guard Tony Lee (NEC Choice Hotels Player of the Week - 12/18/06) ... Junior guard Tony Lee (NEC Choice Hotels Player of the Week - 1/2/07).

Running With the Devil - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 4-0, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 25-18 (.581) under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In each of RMU's 13 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

Iron Man - Senior guard Derek Coleman doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Thursday's game @ Long Island having played a full 40 minutes in six of the club's 13 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 29 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.2 minutes per game in 81 starts.

Making It Count - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach Mark Schmidt has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials rank second in the circuit in free throw percentage, converting 72.6 percent (164-for-226) of their opportunites. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting 78.6 percent (55-for-70) of its shots in the last five minutes of games. Senior guard Derek Coleman and senior forward A.J. Jackson have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, and they have come through, combining to hit 23 of their 26 opportunities (88.5 percent).

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard Tony Lee was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is the fourth highest singlegame total of the 2006-07 season, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell (10 steals vs. UNC Pembroke; 11/11/06) and Darren Collison of UCLA (nine vs. Long Beach State; 11/28/06) and Damian Martin of Loyola Marymount (nine vs. Boise State; 12/19/06), who each have posted nine steals.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard Derek Coleman, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has done a solid job this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time. The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior Derek Coleman entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 23 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 164, which ranks fifth all-time at RMU. With 14 regular-season games remaining in 2006-07, Coleman needs 55 three-pointers to eclipse the record of 218 held by Thomas. Over that span Coleman will need to average 3.9 three-pointers per game.

Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward A.J. Jackson has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 18.4 points and 10.0 rebounds in 20 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. The Chappell Show - Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell has battled through a sophomore season that has seen opposing defenses use a double team to make him work for shots. In RMU's recently completed homestand there are signs that Chappell is breaking out of his funk, as he led the Colonials with 16 points while adding eight rebounds in a 64-48 win over Central Connecticut State (1/6/07). It marks the first time in 2006-07 Chappell has led Robert Morris in scoring. In victories over Quinnipiac (1/4/07) and the Blue Devils, Chappell averaged 17.0 points and 7.0 rebounds while shooting 55.6 percent (15-for-27) from the field.

New Wave - Freshman guard Mezie Nwigwe has quietly given Robert Morris a steady influence off the bench this season, and it seems like with each passing game he gains more confidence. In a 64-48 win over Central Connecticut State (1/6/07) Nwigwe hit a pair of big three-pointers in the first half for the Colonials and in his last seven games has averaged 5.6 points per contest, including a career high 12-point performance in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06).

#### The Race To 1,000

Entering the 2006-07 campaign, Robert Morris returned a total of **81.6** percent of its scoring and **75.9** percent of its rebounding from 2005-06 thanks to the return of senior guard **Derek Coleman**, senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, junior guard **Tony Lee** and sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**. While Chappell is well on his way to becoming a 1,000-point scorer at RMU after a freshman campaign in which he was named the 2006 NEC Rookie of the Year, Coleman, Jackson and Lee each entered this season with outside shots of joining RMU's 1,000-point club. **Home Sweet Home** - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 48-23 (.676) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 171-104 (.622).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward A.J. Jackson got off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. Streakers - Thanks to 12 points in a 64-48 win over Central Connecticut State (1/6/07), junior guard Tony Lee has now scored in double figures in 11 straight games, which is the third longest streak by a Colonial on the active roster. It also ties Lee's career-best streak, when he scored in double figures in 11 straight contests from Jan. 26, 2006 to March 2, 2006. In all, Lee has scored in double figures in 25 of his last 28 games dating back to the 2005-06 campaign.

#### 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward A.J. Jackson on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

#### The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of Mark Schmidt during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.45), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.20 three-pointers a game.
