Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team closes out a two-game road trip Saturday night when it travels to Hackensack, N.J., for a 7:30 p.m. Northeast Conference game @ Fairleigh Dickinson. The Colonials had their season-high five-game winning streak snapped with a 59-56 setback @ Long Island (1/11/07) in their last contest and have dropped three straight on the road in league games. RMU currently sits in a tie for seventh place in the league standings with its 2-3 league mark, while the Knights are the lone undefeated team remaining in conference play at 3-0. Robert Morris returns home for a two-game homestand after Saturday's game, starting Thursday, Jan. 18, with a 7:00 p.m. tilt against Sacred Heart.

Quick Stat of the Night - If Robert Morris is to climb out of the hole its dug itself in Northeast Conference play, the Colonials are going to need more production from their reserves. In RMU's 59-56 loss @ Long Island (1/11/07) that snapped a five-game winning streak, the Blackbirds bench outscored the Robert Morris reserves, 19-0. Four players for RMU combined to shoot 0-for-6 from the field in 42 minutes of action. It's a disturbing trend for the Colonials in the early portion of league play, as in the first five games opponents have outscored RMU in bench points, 127-47. On the road its been even worse for the Colonials, as in three league games away from the Charles L. Sewall Center opponent reserves have outscored the RMU bench, 90-21.

Saturday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - Fairleigh Dickinson and Robert Morris will tip off for the 55th time Saturday night, with the Knights holding a 29-25 edge in the all-time series. FDU has won four straight over the Colonials entering Saturday's tilt, including three wins during the 2005-06 campaign. RMU dropped an 84-83 decision to Fairleigh Dickinson at the Charles L. Sewall Center (1/28/06) before suffering a 93-78 setback at the Rothman Center (2/6/06). The Knights also downed Robert Morris, 71-55 at the Rothman Center, in the 2006 Northeast Conference Tournament semifinals (3/5/06).

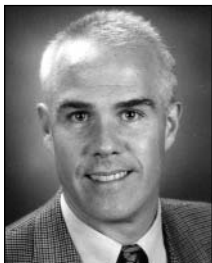

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 75-83 (.475), including a 51-46 (.526) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Knights - Fairleigh Dickinson is the only undefeated team left in Northeast Conference play at 3-0 entering Saturday's game against Robert Morris and also owns an overall record of 8-6. Leading the way for the Knights has been senior forward Andre Harris, who scores at a 18.6 points per game clip to lead the NEC. Sophomore guard Cameron Tyler, who exploded for a career high 31 points in a 91-84 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) (1/11/07), took over the NEC lead in assists (5.29 per game) from RMU senior guard Derek Coleman. Fairleigh Dickinson also leads the NEC in rebounding offense with an average of 38.3 per game.

Fairleigh Dickinson Head Coach - The dean of Northeast Conference coaches, **Tom Green (Syracuse '71)** is in his 24th season as head coach of the Knights. He owns a career record of 386-298 (.564), all with Fairleigh Dickinson, and is the all-time NEC wins leader.

RMU's Last Game - Long Island closed the game on a 13-5 run and turned a five-point deficit into a 59-56 victory to snap RMU's five-game winning streak Jan 11. Robert Morris owned a 51-46 lead with 4:26 to play after a three-pointer from senior guard **Derek Coleman**, which capped a 15-1 Colonial run to help them climb out of a nine-point deficit. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** gave Robert Morris the lead, 48-46, with a three-pointer, which was followed by Coleman's trifecta. The Blackbirds closed to within 51-48 after a pair of free throws from Paska Morkeliunas, and Eugene Kotorbai knotted the score at 51 with a three-pointer from the corner with 3:25 to play. Long Island took the lead for good when Jaytornah Wisseh drove the lane uncontested to score a layup for a 53-51 edge. Wisseh hit a pair of free throws with 23 seconds remaining to give LIU a 55-51 advantage, but Chappell came back and drained a three-pointer with 17 seconds to play to pull the Colonials within one, 55-54. Tyrone Mattison was fouled on the ensuing inbounds by Coleman, who picked up his fifth infraction on the play to end his game. Mattison, who was 0-for-7 from the field and 0-for-2 from the free-throw line up to that point, hit a pair from the charity stripe to give Long Island a 57-54 lead with 15 seconds left. The Colonials called timeout with 12.9 seconds remaining, and out of the timeout Chappell's three-pointer was off the mark, but junior guard **Tony Lee** grabbed the offensive board for the putback and RMU was again down one, 57-56. Aubin Scott was fouled on the inbounds by freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** with 5.6 seconds remaining, and he hit both of his chances from the free-throw line to make it 59-56 in favor of the Blackbirds. RMU had one last chance, but instead of spotting up for a three-pointer Lee drove the length of the court and missed a jumper, ending the game. In a defensive struggle that featured 45 fouls in a 40-minute game, neither club got much going in the first half as Long Island entered the break with a 23-21 edge. The Colonials shot just 29.6 percent (8-for-27) from the floor in the first half but got back in the game by converting 50 percent (13-for-26) of their shots after the break.

Long Island Game Notes - Each team posted shooting percentages of 39.6 percent, with RMU hitting on 21 of 53 field goal attempts, while Long Island converted 19 of its 48 opportunities ... It marked the first time this season in 14 games RMU failed to either own a double-digit lead or trail by double digits ... The Blackbird bench outscored the Colonial reserves, 19-0 ... Freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe**, sophomore forward **Ifeanyi Ehirim** and junior forward **Colson Sénat** combined to shoot 0-for-6 from the field off the bench ... It marked the first time this season Robert Morris received zero points from its bench ... The Colonials outrebounded Long Island, 39-35, including a 14-12 edge on the offensive glass ... The Colonials converted just 50 percent (7-for-14) of their shots from the free-throw line while LIU hit on 17 of its 29 opportunities (58.6 percent).

Settling In - Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, after not pacing Robert Morris in scoring in the club's first 12 games of the 2006-07 campaign, enters Saturday's game @ Fairleigh Dickinson having led the Colonials in scoring in each of the last two games. Chappell scored 16 points to lead RMU in a 64-48 win over Central Connecticut State (1/6/07), then tied a season high with 19 points in a 59-56 setback @ Long Island (1/11/07). Since returning to Northeast Conference play with the start of the 2007 calendar year, Chappell has averaged 17.7 points in his last three games while shooting 51.1 percent (23-for-45) from the field. His points per game average of 15.0 leads Robert Morris in league play thus far and also ranks 14th in the league standings.

Center of Attention - While a lot of attention is paid to RMU's "Big Four" in regard to scoring, the Colonials wouldn't be where they are without the contributions from senior center **Freddie Harris**. In the last six games Harris has become a bigger factor for Robert Morris, averaging 7.5 points and 4.3 rebounds in just over a shade of 20 minutes of work (20.5 minutes per contest). Even more impressive has been the shooting touch employed by Harris. In the last six games Harris is shooting a spectacular 68 percent (17-for-25) from the field.

Stingy - If Robert Morris is to get back in the win column Saturday night @ Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07), the defensive intensity will have to continue. The Colonials enter Saturday's game against the Knights currently leading the NEC in scoring defense, allowing an average of 65.5 points per game. That's ahead of perennial scoring defense leader Monmouth, which yields an average of 66.7 points per contest. Entering this season, RMU allowed an average of 72.0 ppg in five seasons under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. Keeping their opponent under 70 points a game has been beneficial for the Colonials in the Schmidt era, as well, as since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign RMU is 14-4 when holding its opponents under 70 points in a contest.

Swiss Cheese - Looking for a reason the Colonials are leading the Northeast Conference in scoring defense by allowing an average of 65.5 points per game? Look no further than RMU's defense of the three-pointer. Robert Morris enters its key league showdown @ Fairleigh Dickinson Saturday night **leading** the conference in three-point field goal percent defense, allowing its opponents to convert just **30.0** percent (**91-for-303**). The Colonials have been even better in recent games, as in the last six games opponents have shot a paltry **27.8** percent (**35-for-126**) from beyond the arc. In all, opponents have shot better than 40 percent from long range in just three of RMU's first 14 contests.

On A Roll - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** notched his second career double double in RMU's Northeast Conference home opener against Quinnipiac (1/4/07), scoring 13 points and dishing out a career high 11 assists. In the first five league games of the 2006-07 campaign Coleman has done a solid job of creating offense, averaging 6.4 assists per contest, which leads the circuit. Even with his success distributing the ball, Coleman is in the midst of his best stretch shooting from the free-throw line. Entering Saturday's tilt @ Fairleigh Dickinson Coleman has converted each of his last 17 opportunities at the charity stripe in his last seven games. On the season Coleman leads the NEC in free-throw percentage at 90.6 percent.

Both Ends of the Floor - Junior guard **Tony Lee** has been the most complete player for Robert Morris in the first half of the 2006-07 season, and the evidence is in the numbers. Offensively, Lee leads the Colonials in scoring (16.0 ppg) while pacing the Northeast Conference in field goal percentage (.631). Defensively, Lee also leads the circuit in steals by averaging 3.31 per game. In the national rankings, Lee enters this week's play ranked fourth in Division I in steals, while his field goal percentage ranks 17th. A look at the numbers ...

Paint by Numbers - RMU's shooting woes from beyond the three-point arc in recent weeks has been well documented, yet despite those struggles the Colonials have begun to balance out their offense. Robert Morris looks to get back in the win column Saturday @ Fairleigh Dickinson having outscored its opponent, **204-120**, in points in the paint in its last six games. As a whole RMU has done a more than adequate job of working the ball inside so far in 2006-07, averaging 32.8 points in the paint this season and outscoring their opponent in the category in nine of its first 14 tilts. Take away the three-point shooting by the Colonials in 2006-07 (32.8 percent) and Robert Morris is shooting 53.6 percent (274-for-511) in two-point field goals.

Mr. Perfect - Junior guard **Tony Lee** certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club is off to a 10-4 start to the 2006-07 season, and he probably was never more valuable in a game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1-for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

The Encore - While junior guard **Tony Lee** nailed all eight of his shots from the field in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06), freshman guard **Jimmy Langhurst** provided the encore in an 83-38 win over Division III Goucher (12/30/06). Langhurst hit all four of his shots from the field, including two from long range, and sank all four of his free-throw opportunities in producing a career high 14 points and finishing second on the club in scoring against the Gophers. Possibly the purest shooter on the club, Langhurst has hit on 66.7 percent (6-of-9) of his shots this season, including three of his four opportunities from downtown.

Straight Shooter - Junior guard **Tony Lee** hit his first six shots from the field in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) before missing a three-pointer with a minute to go in the first half. With that missed trifecta it ended a streak of 16 straight field goals for Lee dating back to the club's 79-78 win over Youngstown State (12/16/06). Lee hit his last two field goals against the Penguins, all eight of his shots in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) before hitting his first six shots from the floor against the Gophers.

Road Warrior - While junior guard **Tony Lee** has been as consistent a player as any for Robert Morris this season, he seems to raise his game when the Colonials go on the road. Lee seems to love playing away from the Charles L. Sewall Center, as so far this season he has shot a solid 57.4 percent (35-for-61) from the field in averaging 12.3 points per game. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Lee has scored in double figures in 18 of his last 22 road games and over that span is averaging 13.3 points, 7.3 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.9 steals per game while shooting 48.4 percent (106-for-219).

Did You Know? RMU's +34 scoring margin in its victories over Quinnipiac (1/4/07) and Central Connecticut State (1/6/07) is the best such mark by a Robert Morris club under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. The previous best was a +32 scoring margin in wins over St. Francis (N.Y.) (93-80; 1/10/02) and Long Island (85-66; 1/12/02) in Schmidt's first year as head coach in 2001-02.

Hard to Imagine - A very important part to senior guard **Derek Coleman's** offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 167 three-pointers on his career, which ranks fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 41 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

The Strokes - Despite an 0-for-4 performance from beyond the arc in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), it didn't stop **Derek Coleman** from coming through when RMU needed him most. Coleman finished 6-for-6 from the free-throw line against the Golden Griffins, including 4-for-4 in the last 34 seconds to help seal the victory. Coleman owns a free-throw shooting percentage of 90.6 percent (29-for-32) so far this season, which is tops in the Northeast Conference. Coleman could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Thursday's game @ Long Island with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 85.4 percent.

Select Company - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris enters the second half of the 2006-07 campaign. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06) in the club's first road game of the season, senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel the Colonials to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

Running With the Devil - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 4-1, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 25-19 (.568) under sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In 13 of RMU's 14 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

Iron Man - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Saturday's game @ Fairleigh Dickinson having played a full 40 minutes in six of the club's 14 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 29 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.0 minutes per game in 82 starts.

Making It Count - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach **Mark Schmidt** has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials rank second in the circuit in free throw percentage, converting **71.3 percent (171-for-240)** of their opportunities. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting **78.6 percent (55-for-70)** of its shots in the last five minutes of games. Senior guard **Derek Coleman** and senior forward **A.J. Jackson** have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, and they have come through, combining to hit 23 of their 26 opportunities (88.5 percent).

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard **Tony Lee** was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is the fourth highest single-game total of the 2006-07 season, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell (10 steals vs. UNC Pembroke; 11/11/06) and Darren Collison of UCLA (nine vs. Long Beach State; 11/28/06) and Damian Martin of Loyola Marymount (nine vs. Boise State; 12/19/06), who each have posted nine steals.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has done a solid job this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time. Coleman currently ranks second in the Northeast Conference in assists per game (5.21) after leading the circuit in 2005-06 with an average of 4.7 per game.

The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 26 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 167, which ranks fifth all-time at RMU. With 13 regular-season games remaining in 2006-07, Coleman needs 52 three-pointers to eclipse the record of 218 held by Thomas. Over that span Coleman will need to average 4.0 three-pointers per game.

Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 18.4 points and 10.0 rebounds in 20 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. Spread The Jam - One of the strength's for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and that has never been more evident than the during RMU's five-game winning streak. In the last six contests RMU has converted a total of 163 field goals, with the club posting assists on 97 of those baskets. That equates to almost 60 percent (59.5) of the club's field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging **15.86** assists per game, which **leads** the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach **Mark Schmidt** is 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

New Wave - Freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** has quietly given Robert Morris a steady influence off the bench this season, and it seems like with each passing game he gains more confidence. In a 64-48 win over Central Connecticut State (1/6/07) Nwigwe hit a pair of big three-pointers in the first half for the Colonials and in his last eight games has averaged 4.8 points per contest, including a career high 12-point performance in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06).

The Race To 1,000

Entering the 2006-07 campaign, Robert Morris returned a total of **81.6** percent of its scoring and **75.9** percent of its rebounding from 2005-06 thanks to the return of senior guard **Derek Coleman**, senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, junior guard **Tony Lee** and sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**. While Chappell is well on his way to becoming a 1,000-point scorer at RMU after a freshman campaign in which he was named the 2006 NEC Rookie of the Year, Coleman, Jackson and Lee each entered this season with outside shots of joining RMU's 1,000-point club. Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 48-23 (.676) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 171-104 (.622).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** got off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.45), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.18 three-pointers a game.
