Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team opens a two-game homestand Thursday night when it welcomes Sacred Heart to the Charles L. Sewall Center for a 7:00 p.m. Northeast Conference contest. The Colonials snapped a three-game slide in conference road games in their last contest thanks to a 70-66 victory @ Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07) and welcome the top team in the NEC Thursday, as the Pioneers are tied for first in the league standings with Central Connecticut State thanks to marks of 4-1. RMU looks to stay perfect at home when it hosts Sacred Heart Thursday, as the club is 7-0 this season and 18-2 at the Sewall Center since the start of the 2005-06 campaign. Robert Morris will also host Mount St. Mary's, Saturday, Jan. 20, for another 7:00 p.m. NEC tussle as part of its homestand.

Quick Stat of the Night - Robert Morris heads into its key Northeast Conference game with Sacred Heart Thursday night outscoring its opponents at home by an average of 16.9 points per game due in large part to the club's ability to hit the glass. The Colonials have outrebounded their opponents by a margin of +6.3 caroms a game and are holding opponents to under 30 boards a contest (28.0). More importantly, RMU has posted a margin of +2.9 in offensive rebounds in home games, which has allowed the Colonials to outscore their opponents, 87-61, in second chance points at the Sewall Center.

Thursday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - Sacred Heart and Robert Morris will meet for just the 14th time Thursday, with the Colonials holding an 8-5 edge in the all-time series. The Pioneers have won two straight games over RMU, including a 90-74 win at the Pitt Center in Fairfield, Conn. (12/7/06) in the first meeting between the two clubs this season. In that contest Sacred Heart received 52 points from its bench and owned a lead as large as 22 in the second half. Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** paced Robert Morris by finishing with 18 points, while junior guard **Tony Lee** contributed 17 points.

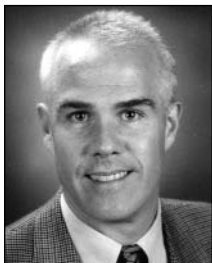

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 76-83 (.478), including a 52-46 (.531) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Pioneers - Sacred Heart enters Thursday's game with RMU sporting an overall record of 8-8, including a mark of 4-1 in the Northeast Conference. The Pioneers are currently tied for first place in the league standings with Central Connecticut State. Leading the way for SHU has been senior forward Jarrid Frye, who averages team highs in both scoring (12.6 ppg) and rebounding (5.4 rpg). Coming on as of late for the Pioneers has been junior forward Joey Henley, who is averaging 18.2 points per contest in league tilts while grabbing 6.8 rebounds a game in the same span.

Sacred Heart Head Coach - In his 29th season as head coach of the Pioneers is **Dave Bike (Sacred Heart '69)**, who owns an overall record of 436-395 (.524). During the 1985-86 season, Bike led the Pioneers to the NCAA Division II national title with a 93-87 win over Southeast Missouri State in the championship game at the Springfield Civic Center. That year's Sacred Heart team finished with a record of 30-4.

RMU's Last Game - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson's** layup with 16 seconds to play on a hi-low feed from senior guard **Derek Coleman** gave Robert Morris the lead for good en route to a 70-66 win at Fairleigh Dickinson Jan. 13. During Jackson's layup he was fouled by Jordan Ingram of the Knights, and Jackson converted the old-fashioned three-point play to give the Colonials a 68-66 advantage. FDU brought the ball down and Cameron Tyler tried to feed the ball inside to Andre Harris for an answer to Jackson's score, but freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** came up with the steal to give the ball back to RMU. Nwigwe was fouled immediately following the theft, and he helped seal the victory with a pair from the free-throw line with 3.2 seconds to play. The Knights owned a 61-56 advantage with 4:29 remaining after a wide open three-pointer from Tyler, but the Colonials slowly chipped away. Jackson's layup made it 61-58 in favor of FDU, and after a 1-for-2 performance from Harris at the free-throw line made it a 62-58 lead for the Knights, sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** drained a three-pointer with 3:41 to go to close RMU's deficit to one, 62-61. Harris would score on a dunk on a baseball pass from Tyler to keep Fairleigh Dickinson in front, 64-61, but junior guard **Tony Lee** hit a pair from the charity stripe at the 2:27 mark of the second half to close Robert Morris to within one again, 64-63. After a Harris turnover that went out of bounds off his leg, Jackson gave the Colonials a 65-64 lead with 1:58 to play on a layup. Harris, however, atoned for his miscue with a pair from the free-throw line with 41 seconds to play after a foul by Nwigwe. Robert Morris then called time-out, and after Coleman worked the clock he fed Jackson in the paint with a bounce pass, and Jackson scored the layup and was fouled during the play by Ingram, giving the Colonials the lead for good. Jackson led all scorers in the game with 21 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the field and a 3-for-3 performance at the free-throw line. Coleman added 18 points for RMU, while Nwigwe supplied 12 points off the bench and Chappell recorded his first double-double of the 2006-07 season with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Fairleigh Dickinson Game Notes - Despite RMU owning double-digit leads on three occasions the last 13:32 of the contest featured five ties and 10 lead changes ... The Knights outrebounded the Colonials, 40-32, including a 14-9 edge on the offensive glass ... Senior guard **Derek Coleman** posted a season high four steals ... Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** played a full 40 minutes, the first time this season he has played an entire game ... RMU shot 81.3 percent (13-for-16) from the free-throw line, while FDU converted just 66.7 percent (12-for-18) of its shots from the charity stripe ... Junior forward **Colson Sénat** finished 0-for-5 from the field and enters Thursday's game against Sacred Heart in a 1-for-11 (nine percent) funk ... The Colonials hit on 12 of their 24 field goal attempts (50 percent) in the second half.

Stingy - A key reason that Robert Morris has had its fair share of success this season has been due to defensive intensity. The Colonials enter Thursday's game against Sacred Heart currently ranked second in the NEC in scoring defense by allowing an average of 65.5 points per game. It's just a shade behind Central Connecticut State, which leads the circuit by yielding just 65.4 points a contest. Entering this season, RMU allowed an average of 72.0 ppg in five seasons under head coach **Mark Schmidt**. Keeping their opponent under 70 points a game has been beneficial for the Colonials in the Schmidt era, as well, as since the beginning of the 2005-06 campaign RMU is 15-4 when holding its opponents under 70 points in a contest.

Shutdown - RMU's recently discovered defensive intensity will be put to the test Thursday against Sacred Heart, as the Pioneers enter the contest averaging a Northeast Conference-best 75.5 points per game. SHU has been even better in league tilts, averaging 82.5 points a contest. Something will have to give Thursday, as the Colonials haven't allowed more than 70 points in a game since an 81-77 victory @ Canisius (12/20/06), a stretch of five games. Over that span opponents are averaging just 55.8 points per contest. It marks the second time under sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** RMU has held its opponents under 70 points for five straight games and the longest stretch since the 1989-90 season. That year the Colonials went 4-1 in their last five regular-season games and held Fairleigh Dickinson (58) and Monmouth (66) under 70 points in the NEC Tournament, a span of seven consecutive games, to claim their fourth NEC title.

Swiss Cheese - Looking for a reason the Colonials are leading the Northeast Conference in scoring defense by allowing an average of 65.5 points per game? Look no further than RMU's defense of the three-pointer. Robert Morris enters its key league showdown against Sacred Heart **leading** the conference in three-point field goal percent defense, allowing its opponents to convert just **30.1 percent (97-for-322)** of its shots from long range. The Colonials have been even better in recent weeks, as in the last seven games opponents have shot a paltry **28.3 percent (41-for-145)** from beyond the arc. In all, opponents have shot better than 40 percent from the three-point line in just three of RMU's first 15 contests.

Downtown - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** established a season high in three-point field goals in RMU's 70-66 victory @ Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07), converting five of his seven opportunities en route to an 18-point performance. It marks the seventh time in Coleman's career he has hit at least five trifectas in a game, and his performance helped him jump up to fourth on the Northeast Conference leaderboard in three-point field goal percentage at 41.9 percent.

Double Vision - Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, who has seemed to locate his shooting touch in recent weeks, came on strong on the boards in RMU's 70-66 win @ Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07). He finished with 10 rebounds to go along with 10 points, his first double-double of the 2006-07 campaign and third of his career. Since returning to Northeast Conference play with the start of the 2007 calendar year, Chappell has averaged 15.8 points and 6.5 rebounds in his last four games while shooting 47.3 percent (26-for-55) from the field. Chappell's average of 14.2 points per game against league opponents leads the club while ranking 14th in the conference.

20/20 Vision - Most head coaches will tell you that the first five minutes of each half and getting off to a good start is crucial for a team's success. The same holds true for Robert Morris, and playing a good first half has been beneficial for the Colonials. So far on the 2006-07 campaign, RMU boasts a record of 8-0 when entering halftime with a lead and dating back to the 2005-06 season the club has won 12 straight when leading at the break. The last loss for the Colonials when they held a lead at halftime was a 75-69 defeat @ Wagner (1/21/06), when Robert Morris held a 42-25 advantage at the break, only to be outscored, 50-27, in the second half. Defense has been a big reason as to why RMU is 8-0 this season when leading at halftime. Opponents have combined to shoot just 42.3 percent (88-for-208) from the field in games in which the Colonials have owned a lead at the break.

Both Ends of the Floor - Junior guard **Tony Lee** has been the most complete player for Robert Morris in the first half of the 2006-07 season, and the evidence is in the numbers. Offensively, Lee ranks second for Robert Morris in scoring (14.8 ppg) while pacing the Northeast Conference in field goal percentage (.604). Defensively, Lee also leads the circuit in steals by averaging 3.07 per game. In the national rankings through games of Jan. 15, 2007, Lee ranks fifth in Division I in steals, while his field goal percentage ranks 24th. He is the only player from an NEC school to rank in the 25 top in two categories. A look at the numbers ...

Paint by Numbers - RMU's shooting woes from beyond the three-point arc in recent weeks has been well documented, yet despite those struggles the Colonials have begun to balance out their offense. Robert Morris enters Thursday's game against Sacred Heart having outscored its opponent, **236-148**, in points in the paint in its last seven games. As a whole RMU has done a more than adequate job of working the ball inside so far in 2006-07, averaging 32.7 points in the paint this season and outscoring their opponent in the category in 10 of its first 15 tilts. Take away the three-point shooting by the Colonials in 2006-07 (33.2 percent) and Robert Morris is shooting 52.8 percent (292-for-553) in two-point field goals.

Mr. Perfect - Junior guard **Tony Lee** certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club is off to a 11-4 start to the 2006-07 season, and he probably was never more valuable in a game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1-for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

The Encore - While junior guard **Tony Lee** nailed all eight of his shots from the field in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06), freshman guard **Jimmy Langhurst** provided the encore in an 83-38 win over Division III Goucher (12/30/06). Langhurst hit all four of his shots from the field, including two from long range, and sank all four of his free-throw opportunities in producing a career high 14 points and finishing second on the club in scoring against the Gophers. Possibly the purest shooter on the club, Langhurst has hit on 66.7 percent (6-of-9) of his shots this season, including three of his four opportunities from downtown.

Straight Shooter - Junior guard **Tony Lee** hit his first six shots from the field in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) before missing a three-pointer with a minute to go in the first half. With that missed trifecta it ended a streak of 16 straight field goals for Lee dating back to the club's 79-78 win over Youngstown State (12/16/06). Lee hit his last two field goals against the Penguins, all eight of his shots in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) before hitting his first six shots from the floor against the Gophers.

Hard to Imagine - A very important part to senior guard **Derek Coleman's** offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 172 three-pointers on his career, which ranks fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 42 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

The Strokes - Despite an 0-for-4 performance from beyond the arc in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), it didn't stop **Derek Coleman** from coming through when RMU needed him most. Coleman finished 6-for-6 from the free-throw line against the Golden Griffins, including 4-for-4 in the last 34 seconds to help seal the victory. Coleman owns a free-throw shooting percentage of 88.2 percent (30-for-34) so far this season, which ranks second in the Northeast Conference. Coleman could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Thursday's game against Sacred Heart with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 82.5 percent (151-for-183).

Select Company - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris enters the second half of the 2006-07 campaign. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06) in the club's first road game of the season, senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel the Colonials to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

Running With the Devil - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 5-1, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 26-19 (.578) under sixth-year head coach **Mark Schmidt** in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In 14 of RMU's 15 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

Iron Man - Senior guard **Derek Coleman** doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Thursday's game against Sacred Heart having played a full 40 minutes in six of the club's 15 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 29 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 45-minute stint @ St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/18/06) in a 70-69 overtime loss to the Terriers. Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.1 minutes per game in 83 starts.

Making It Count - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach **Mark Schmidt** has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials rank second in the circuit in free throw percentage, converting **71.9 percent (184-for-256)** of their opportunities. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting a solid **80.0 percent (60-for-75)** of its shots in the last five minutes of games. Senior guard **Derek Coleman** and senior forward **A.J. Jackson** have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, and they have come through, combining to hit 24 of their 27 opportunities (88.9 percent).

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard **Tony Lee** was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is the fourth highest single-game total of the 2006-07 season, behind only Ledell Eackles of Campbell (10 steals vs. UNC Pembroke; 11/11/06) and Darren Collison of UCLA (nine vs. Long Beach State; 11/28/06) and Damian Martin of Loyola Marymount (nine vs. Boise State; 12/19/06), who each have posted nine steals.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard **Derek Coleman**, who proved himself an accurate three-point shooter in 2005-06, has done a solid job this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out nine assists in a 77-64 win over New Hampshire (11/21/06), pushing his career total to 306 dimes, just the ninth Colonial in school history to dish out over 300 career assists. After entering this season ranked 11th all-time at Robert Morris for assists, Coleman now ranks seventh all-time. Coleman currently is tops in the Northeast Conference in assists per game (5.13) after leading the circuit in 2005-06 with an average of 4.7 per game.

The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 31 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 172, which ranks fifth all-time at RMU. With 12 regular-season games remaining in 2006-07, Coleman needs 47 three-pointers to eclipse the record of 218 held by Thomas. Over that span Coleman will need to average 3.9 three-pointers per game.

Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 18.4 points and 10.0 rebounds in 20 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. Spread The Jam - One of the strength's for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and it's a trend that has continued as the Colonials have returned to league play. In the last seven contests RMU has converted a total of 188 field goals, with the club posting assists on 108 of those baskets. That equates to almost 60 percent (57.4) of the club's field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging **15.53** assists per game, which **leads** the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach **Mark Schmidt** is 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

New Wave - Freshman guard **Mezie Nwigwe** has quietly given Robert Morris a steady influence off the bench this season, and it seems like with each passing game he gains more confidence. Nwigwe tied a season and career high with 12 points in the club's 70-66 win @ Fairleigh Dickinson (1/13/07), including a pair of free throws with less than five seconds to play that helped ice the win. Over his last six games Nwigwe is averaging 6.1 points per contest while shooting 46.4 percent (13-for-28) from the field, including 54.5 percent (6-for-11) from beyond the arc.

The Race To 1,000

Entering the 2006-07 campaign, Robert Morris returned a total of **81.6** percent of its scoring and **75.9** percent of its rebounding from 2005-06 thanks to the return of senior guard **Derek Coleman**, senior forward **A.J. Jackson**, junior guard **Tony Lee** and sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell**. While Chappell is well on his way to becoming a 1,000-point scorer at RMU after a freshman campaign in which he was named the 2006 NEC Rookie of the Year, Coleman, Jackson and Lee each entered this season with outside shots of joining RMU's 1,000-point club. Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Under head coach **Mark Schmidt**, RMU has posted a record of 48-23 (.676) at the Sewall Center in six seasons and overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 171-104 (.622).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward **A.J. Jackson** got off to a solid start for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign, becoming the first Colonial in school history to score at least 20 points in the first four games of a season. Jackson also is just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games, joining former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99), Gene Nabors (1995-2000) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in both the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. 2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five first-place votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward **A.J. Jackson** on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Marques Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of **Mark Schmidt** during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.45), ahead of St. Francis (N.Y.), which has averaged 7.16 three-pointers a contest.
