Top Story - The Robert Morris University men's basketball team returns home to the Charles L. Sewall Center to close out its 2006-07 regular season Monday night when it hosts Long Island for a Northeast Conference tilt. The Colonials, losers of three of their last four games, are coming off an 81-75 loss @ Quinnipiac (2/24/07). Despite the loss, RMU clinched a spot in the 2007 NEC Tournament due to LIU's loss @ Saint Francis (Pa.) (2/24/07). Robert Morris can finish anywhere from fourth to eighth in the NEC standings based on the last night of regular season action in the conference Monday night. The 2007 NEC Tournament, to be held at campus sites, is set for March 1, 4 and 7.

Quick Stat of the Night - Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell seems to be warming up just at the right time for Robert Morris. Over the course of the last nine games, Chappell is scoring at an 18.3 points per game clip while adding averages of 4.8 rebounds, 2.8 assists and 1.8 steals per game. Even more impressively, the shot that seemed lost for Chappell early in the season has been found. Chappell has shot 50.4 percent (61-for-121) from the field over the same time span. Chappell enters Monday night's regular season finale against Long Island ranked third on the club in scoring at 14.5 points per game, which ranks 10th in the Northeast Conference. Chappell is one of three Colonials, joining junior guard Tony Lee and senior forward A.J. Jackson, ranked in the top 10 in the NEC in scoring.

Monday's Opponent and the All-Time Series - Robert Morris and Long Island square off for the 55th time Monday night, with the Colonials holding a 30-24 lead in the all-time series. The Blackbirds won the first game of the 2006-07 season series thaks to a 59-56 win in Brooklyn, N.Y., at the Wellness, Recreation and Athletic

Center (1/11/07). In that contest sophomore guard **Jeremy Chappell** paced the Colonials with 19 points, while senior forward **A.J. Jackson** and senior guard **Derek Coleman** each scored 11 points. Jackson also contributed nine rebounds along with junior guard **Tony Lee**.

Head Coach Mark Schmidt Sixth Season - Boston College '85



The 2006-07 campaign marks **Mark Schmidt's** sixth year as head coach of the men's basketball program at Robert Morris University. He owns an overall record of 81-89 (.476), including a 57-52 (.523) mark in the Northeast Conference, and was named to his current post May 7, 2001. Schmidt guided the Colonials to their first winning season in six years in 2005-06 with an overall record of 15-14, including 10-8 in conference action. He also led RMU to the NEC Tournament semifinals for the second time in the last three years in 2006. In 2003-04 and 2004-05, he led RMU to identical overall

records of 14-15. In 2001-02, Schmidt led Robert Morris to a 12-18 overall record, the most victories for a first-year head coach in the 30-year history of the Colonial men's basketball program.

Prior to RMU, Schmidt spent seven seasons as one of the nation's top assistants at Xavier University under current Wake Forest head coach Skip Prosser from 1994-2001. While with the Musketeers, Schmidt played a dual role, serving as both a coach and the program's top recruiter. His coaching responsibilities centered mostly around the post players, and he helped develop and recruit players at Xavier that have moved on to the professional ranks, including James Posey (Miami Heat), David West (New Orleans Hornets), Romain Sato (San Antonio Spurs), Lionel Chalmers (Minnesota Timberwolves) and David Young (Seattle Supersonics). Prior to his stint with Xavier, Schmidt served one year as an assistant at Loyola College in Baltimore, Md., also under Prosser. He also spent two seasons at Penn State University under Bruce Parkhill from 1991-93, and started his coaching career as an assistant at St. Michael's College in Vermont from 1989-91.

Schmidt's playing career was highlighted by four years as a guard/forward at Boston College, where he received his bachelor's degree in business administration and management with a concentration in marketing in 1985. The Eagles went 22-10 and made the NCAA Elite Eight during his freshman season in 1981-82 under head coach Tom Davis and 25-7 the next year in making the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen in his first of three years playing for current Maryland coach Gary Williams. Boston College reached the NIT second round in 1984 and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen again in 1985.

Scouting the Blackbirds - Long Island enters Monday's game with RMU sporting an overall record of 10-18, including a mark of 6-11 in Northeast Conference play. The Blackbirds are currently tied for ninth place in the league standings with St. Francis (N.Y.) but still have a shot at the 2007 NEC Tournament. A win over the Colonials, coupled with a loss by Monmouth @ Saint Francis (Pa.), will push LIU into the postseason fray. The leading scorer for Long Island has been senior guard James Williams, who is averaging 16.0 points per game and has averaged 23.0 points in his last six games. Freshman guard Jaytornah Wisseh has averaged 11.7 ppg since being inserted into the starting lineup six games ago.

Long Island Head Coach - In his fifth season on the sidelines for the Blackbirds is **Jim Ferry (Keene State '90)**, who owns an overall record of 157-106 (.597), including a record of 53-87 (.379) with Long Island. Prior to his stint with LIU, Ferry spent three seasons at Division II Adelphi University, where he guided the Panthers to an overall record of 82-11.

RMU's Last Game - Quinnipiac outscored Robert Morris, 9-3, over the final 4:25 en route to an 81-75 victory Feb 24. RMU jumped out to a 7-3 advantage as sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell scored five points while senior center Freddie Harris chipped in with four. The Bobcats used a 9-2 surge to knot the score at 12-12, but a three-pointer from junior guard Tony Lee and then another trifecta from Chappell gave the Colonials an 18-14 lead with 13:23 to go in the first half. DeMario Anderson helped Quinnipiac off the bench, as he scored 12 points in the first half, including a jumper that gave the Bobcats a 23-20 edge with 10:17 remaining before the break. In a first half that featured five ties and nine lead changes, the Bobcats entered halftime with a 44-42 lead thanks to an 11-6 run in the final four minutes of the stanza. Van Crafton hit a pair of three-pointers during the spurt for Quinnipiac, while Adam Gonzalez added five points. The second half wasn't much different from the first, as it featured a total of nine ties and six lead changes. Chappell knotted the score at 49 with a three-pointer, and his layup with 16:09 to go made the score 51-51. On the layup Chappell was fouled by Crafton, and he converted the three-point play to push the Colonials in front, 52-51. Tied, 58-58, with 11:50 remaining after a jumper from senior guard Derek Coleman, the score was the start of a 9-2 spurt that gave RMU a 65-60 lead with 9:36 to play. Senior forward A.J. Jackson hit a three-pointer during the run, while Lee and Chappell each scored two points. The Bobcats responded with five straight points to tie the score at 65, but Lee's jumper and free throw with 6:49 left in the contest gave the Colonials a 68-65 advantage. Quinnipiac came back to tie the score at 70-70 and used its final surge over the last 4:25 to seal the win. Anderson paced all scorers in the game with 28 points for the Bobcats, while Robert Morris was led by Chappell and Lee, who each scored 21 points. Coleman added 13 points for RMU, while Jackson recorded a double-double thanks to 10 points and 10 rebounds. Lee added seven rebounds, four assists and two steals, while Coleman recorded eight rebounds and four assists.

Quinnipiac Game Notes - RMU shot just 45.3 percent (29-for-64) on the game thanks to a 1-for-10 performance from the field in the final 4:25 ... Quinnipiac shot an even 50 percent (29-for-58) from the floor ... Senior guard Derek Coleman became the 16th player in school history to go over 1,000 career points thanks to his three-pointer with two minutes remaining in the first half and pushed his career point total to 1,009 ... Junior guard Tony Lee joined Coleman in the RMU 1,000-point club in the second half with a layup off an offensive rebound at the 14:13 mark of the second half and pushed his career point total to 1,008 ... Coleman and Lee are the first pair of high school teammates to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau at Robert Morris as each attended Charlestown High School in Boston, Mass. ... Robert Morris held a 38-36 edge on the glass, including a 12-11 advantage in offensive rebounds ... Quinnipiac outscored the Colonials in points in the paint, 32-22, and points off the bench, 40-6.

It Ain't Over Till It's Over - With RMU about to face Long Island Monday night, depending on its outcome with the Blackbirds the Colonials can finish anywhere as high as fourth place in the NEC standings to as low as eighth place. A look at the tiebreaker procedures for Robert Morris heading into its 2006-07 regular-season finale ... A win over LIU will secure RMU at least fifth place ... A win over LIU and a Fairleigh Dickinson loss @ St. Francis (N.Y.) secures RMU in fourth place and a quarterfinal home game in the 2007 NEC Tournament ... A win over LIU, an FDU loss @ St. Francis (N.Y.) and a Wagner win @ Central Conn. State secures RMU in fourth place and a quarterfinal home game in the 2007 NEC Tournament ... A win over LIU, an FDU win @ SFNY and a Wagner win @ CCSU secures RMU in fifth place ... An RMU loss to LIU, a Monmouth win @ Saint Francis (Pa.) and a Wagner win @ CCSU and a Monmouth win @ Saint Francis (Pa.) secures RMU in eighth place.

Forever in Lee Blue Jeans - Junior guard Tony Lee has been as consistent a player for Robert Morris this season and has seemingly saved his basketball for the stretch run of the 2006-07 campaign. In the last nine games Lee has averaged 19.8 points, 6.0 rebounds and 4.6 assists per contest while shooting 57.5 percent (65-for-113) from the field. Lee leads the club in scoring at 16.4 points per game, a total that also ranks fifth in the Northeast Conference.

The Patriot - Any success Robert Morris will have down the stretch of the 2006-07 season will depend in large part to the play of senior guard **Derek Coleman**. A natural playmaker, the Boston, Mass., product has also increased his offensive production since the calendar has switched to the year 2007. In **15** games since returning to league play, Coleman is averaging **14.3** points per contest while shooting **46.1** percent (**71-for-154**) from the floor. Even with the increased offensive output, it hasn't slowed Coleman down in creating opportunities for his teammates. In the same stretch Coleman is averaging **5.8** assists per game.

Double Nickel on a Dime - Junior guard Tony Lee tied for game high honors in assists with four @ Quinnipiac (2/24/07), the 11th time this season he has either led or tied for the team lead in dimes in a game. Lee pushed his season total in the category to 114, second on the club behind senior guard Derek Coleman (142). Coleman and Lee are the first pair of RMU teammates to post at least 100 assists in a season since the 1990-91 campaign, when Andre Boyd (137) and Wade Timmerson (126) turned the trick. Coleman and Lee are also just the third pair overall to accomplish the feat, joining former guards Forest Grant and Chipper Harris, who each finished with at least 100 assists in three straight seasons from 1981 to 1984.

Offensively Speaking - Robert Morris enters Monday's game against Long Island having seemingly hit its stride offensively, as the club has shot a solid 50.2 percent (507-for-1,009) from the field in its last 18 games. Over that span the Colonials have shot 50 percent or better from the field 11 times. Due to the surge, RMU owns a team shooting percentage of 48.0 percent (715-for-1,490) on the season, which leads the Northeast Conference. The Colonials have never lead the league in field goal percentage in 26 years as part of the conference.

Both Ends of the Floor - Junior guard Tony Lee has been the most complete player for Robert Morris in 2006-07, and the evidence is in the numbers. Offensively, Lee is tied for the team lead in scoring (16.2 ppg) while pacing the Northeast Conference in field goal percentage (.600). Defensively, Lee also leads the circuit in steals by averaging 2.85 per game. In the national rankings through games of Feb. 22, 2007, Lee ranks seventh in Division I in steals, while his field goal percentage ranks 20th. He is one of just two players from an NEC school to rank in the 20 top in two categories, joining Central Connecticut State guard Tristan Blackwood. A look at the numbers ...

Triple Threat - Thanks to 21 points @ Quinnipiac (2/24/07) and eclipsing the 1,000-point plateau for his career, junior guard Tony Lee eclipsed a milestone few have accomplished in the history of the Northeast Conference. With career totals of 1.008 points, 520 rebounds and 260 assists, Lee is just the sixth player in league history, and second this season, to eclipse career totals of 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 250 assists. Lee joins Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart, who joined the club when grabbing his 500th rebound Feb. 10 against Wagner. Lee is also the first player in league history to go over those thresholds during his junior seasons.

Combination Platter - So far this season, Robert Morris has received 79.2 percent of its offense from its usual contributors in guards **Derek Coleman**, **Tony Lee** and **Jeremy Chappell** and forward **A.J. Jackson**. Despite that, dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, when Coleman and Jackson combine to score more than 30 points in a game, the Colonials own a record of **18-6** (.**750**). Included in that is a mark of **9-3** so far this season.

Zoom Zoom Zoom - Junior guard Tony Lee picked up his 500th career rebound in RMU's 71-63 win over Wagner (2/18/07) when he finished with eight. Lee entered the game needing just three rebounds for 500 and now owns 520 for his career entering Monday's game against Long Island. Lee also tied the school record for fastest to 500 rebounds, as he accomplished the feat in his 81st career game. RMU's all-time leading rebounder, Anthony Dickens, also notched his 500th career carom in his 81st career game, a 70-59 victory @ Niagara (11/29/89).

Mr. Perfect - Junior guard Tony Lee certainly could be looked at as RMU's most valuable player as the club owns a record of 16-10 in 2006-07 season, and he probably was never more valuable in a game than in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06). Lee finished a perfect 8-for-8 from the field, including 1-for-1 from beyond the arc, in scoring 17 points while adding a team high seven rebounds, four assists and two steals. The only other perfect day for a Robert Morris player on record with more than five field goal attempts was former Colonial Bubba Donnelly (1991-95), who finished 7-for-7 from the field for 21 points in an 80-59 win @ Rider (1/10/94). All seven of Donnelly's field goals in that game were three-pointers.

Hard to Imagine - A very important part to senior guard Derek Coleman's offensive output over his four-year career has been the ability to knock down the three-point shot. Coleman owns 198 three-pointers on his career, which ranks fifth all-time at Robert Morris. However, in RMU's 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/04), Coleman finished with 14 points despite not hitting a three-pointer. He finished 4-for-10 from the field and a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line for his 14 points but was 0-for-4 from beyond the arc. It marks the first time in his career Coleman, with 50 career double-figure scoring games to his credit, finished in double digits without hitting a three-pointer.

The Strokes - Despite having his consecutive streak of free throws snapped at 13 in a 76-68 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) (2/3/07), senior guard Derek Coleman still has shot 86.7 percent (26-for-30) from the free-throw line in his last 10 games. Coleman's run marked his second double-digit streak of the 2006-07 campaign, as he hit 17 straight over a seven-game span in December and January. Coleman currently ranks tied for second in the Northeast Conference with a free-throw percentage of 85.7 percent (60-for-70) and could possibly be making runs at both the single-season and career records for free throw shooting. The single-season mark is held by former Colonial Brandon Welsch, who converted 87.7 percent (71-for-81) of his shots in 1998-99. The career record of 86 percent is held by former Colonial Tom Parks (1978-83). Coleman enters Monday's game against LIU with a career free-throw shooting percentage of 82.6 percent (181-for-219), which ranks third in the career record book at Robert Morris.

Select Company - Senior forward A.J. Jackson, a 2006-07 preseason All-Northeast Conference Team selection, put together one of his best games in a Colonial uniform in RMU's 73-69 win @ Marshall (11/17/06). Jackson finished with 30 points on 9-of-18 shooting and also compiled 15 rebounds, including six offensive boards, for his 15th career double-double. His 30-point effort marks the second time Jackson has hit the 30-point plateau in a contest, while his 15 rebounds marks the third time he has recorded at least 15 caroms in a game. A quick glance at the Robert Morris single-game records, and Jackson has an opportunity to post the most 30-point scoring games in school history and is already tied for the most games with 15+ rebounds. Former Colonial Myron Walker (1991-94) posted six games in which he scored 30 or more points, while former Colonials Earl Cureton (1976-77) and Anthony Dickens (1985-90) own three games of posting at least 15 rebounds in a game. Clutch Shooting - A number of Colonials have begun to show their penchant for clutch shooting late in ball games as Robert Morris enters the second half of the 2006-07 campaign. In a 73-69 victory @ Marshall (11/17/06) in the club's first road game of the season, senior forward A.J. Jackson and senior guard Derek Coleman each hit three-pointers in the last 1:35 of the contest to help propel the Colonials to victory. Coleman's three-pointer with 49 seconds to go gave Robert Morris the lead for good, and it marks his second career three-pointer in the last minute of a game that gave the Colonials a lead. Coleman drained a three-pointer with 12 seconds to play to lift RMU to a 69-68 victory @ Central Connecticut State (2/14/04) during his freshman campaign. Sophomore guard Jeremy Chappell, meanwhile, sunk a three-pointer with 12.3 seconds remaining to lift Robert Morris to a 67-66 win @ Mount St. Mary's (3/3/06) in the 2006 NEC Tournament quarterfinals.

Straight Shooter - Junior guard Tony Lee hit his first six shots from the field in RMU's 83-38 win over Goucher (12/30/06) before missing a three-pointer with a minute to go in the first half. With that missed trifecta it ended a streak of 16 straight field goals for Lee dating back to the club's 79-78 win over Youngstown State (12/16/06). Lee hit his last two field goals against the Penguins, all eight of his shots in an 81-77 win @ Canisius (12/20/06) before hitting his first six shots from the floor against the Gophers.

Running With the Devil - Robert Morris has played some close ball games so far on the 2006-07 season, with the Colonials coming out on top. In games decided by five points or less RMU boasts a record of 7-5, including a pair of one-point victories. That mark has helped Robert Morris improve to 28-23 (.549) under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt in games decided by five points or less. However, basketball is a game of runs, and that has never been more prudent than with Robert Morris in 2006-07. In 21 of RMU's 26 games so far this season, the Colonials have either owned a double-digit lead or trailed by double digits.

Iron Man - Senior guard Derek Coleman doesn't get comfortable sitting on the bench during games. In fact, he rarely is off the court at all. Coleman enters Monday's game against Long Island having played a full contest in 13 of the club's 26 games this season, and in two other contests he has logged 39 minutes. It's a trend that hasn't subsided for RMU's floor general since he became a regular starter for the club at the end of his freshman season. Coleman has played a full game's worth of action a total of 36 times in his Robert Morris career, including a 48-minute stint against St. Francis (N.Y.) (2/17/07). Since earning his first start against Sacred Heart back on Feb. 5, 2004, Coleman has averaged 35.7 minutes per game in 94 starts.

Making It Count - An area of strength for RMU under the direction of head coach Mark Schmidt has been the ability of the team to convert at the free-throw line. Robert Morris has finished in the top five in the Northeast Conference in free-throw percentage each of the previous five years, including a league-best 75.4 percent (384-for-576) in 2003-04. So far this season the Colonials lead the circuit in free throw percentage, converting 74.8 percent (335-for-448) of their opportunities. Robert Morris has been even better in pressure situations, converting a solid 80.8 percent (110-for-136) of its shots in the last five minutes and overtime of games. Senior guard Derek Coleman and senior forward A.J. Jackson have been at the stripe the most in crunch time, combining to hit 54 of their 63 opportunities (85.7 percent).

Pop Goes the Weasel - Junior guard Tony Lee was all over the court in RMU's 73-72 win over Duquesne (12/2/06), especially on defense. Lee broke a 19-year old Charles L. Sewall Center record for steals by registering eight against the Dukes, including three in the last 12:07 as RMU climbed out of a 10-point deficit. Lee's eight steals eclipsed the old record of seven, which was originally established by Drafton Davis of Marist. Davis recorded his seven thefts in a 61-57 overtime victory over the Colonials Feb. 28, 1987. Lee's eight steals is the seventh highest singlegame total of the 2006-07 season in Division I, behind Travis Holmes of VMI (11 steals), Ledell Eackles of Campbell (10 steals) and Darren Collison of UCLA, Damian Martin of Loyola Marymount, Chavis Holmes of VMI and Kevin Bell of Fresno State, who each have posted nine steals.

Creating & Creating - Senior guard Derek Coleman has done a solid job this year doing what he does best: creating opportunities for his teammates. Coleman dished out six assists in a 76-68 win over Saint Francis (Pa.) (2/3/07) to push his career total to 404, becoming just the sixth Colonial in school history with 400 career dimes and the first since Javier Smith finished with 459 from 1994-98. Coleman currently is tops in the Northeast Conference in assists per game (5.46) and is on pace to finish the 2006-07 season with 441 dimes, which would rank fourth all-time at Robert Morris.

Spread The Jam - One of the strengths for Robert Morris on the 2006-07 campaign has been the club's ability to be unselfish, and it's a trend that has continued as the Colonials have returned to league play. In the last 18 contests RMU has converted a total of 507 field goals, with the club posting assists on 294 of those baskets. That equates to almost 60 percent (58.0) of the club's field goals. As a club so far this year Robert Morris is averaging 16.12 assists per game, which leads the Northeast Conference. The highest assist per game average by RMU in the six-year tenure of head coach Mark Schmidt is 15.2 dimes per contest, set in Schmidt's inaugural season as head coach in 2001-02.

Daytona 500 - Junior guard Tony Lee became the 13th member of the Robert Morris 500-rebound club in RMU's 71-63 victory over Wagner (2/18/07) when he finished with eight boards, pushing his career total to 505. Lee is the fourth Colonial in six years to eclipse the 500-rebound plateau under head coach Mark Schmidt, joining Matt Smith (1998-2002), Aaron Thomas (2000-04) and Chaz McCrommon (2000-05). Thanks to an average of 6.3 rebounds per game this season, Lee is on pace to finish the 2006-07 season with 532 rebounds, which would rank tied for ninth all-time.

The Chase Is On - For the second time in three seasons, the Robert Morris career record for three-point field goals could be challenged in 2006-07. Former Colonial Aaron Thomas (2000-04) established a new career record for three-pointers in 2003-04 by finishing his career with 218. That record was only 48 treys ahead of former Colonial Maurice Carter (2001-05) entering the 2004-05 campaign, but Carter hit just 47 in his senior season to finish second in the record books with 217 career three-pointers. Now, thanks to a career high 74 three-pointers in 2005-06, senior **Derek Coleman** entered his final season in 2006-07 a total of 78 three-pointers shy of breaking the record held by Thomas. Coleman owns 57 three-pointers so far on the 2006-07 season, pushing his career total to 198, which ranks fifth all-time at RMU. With at least two games remaining in 2006-07, Coleman needs 21 three-pointers to eclipse the record of 218 held by Thomas.

Home Is Where the Heart Is - Senior forward A.J. Jackson has found the Charles L. Sewall Center to his liking. Dating back to the start of the 2005-06 campaign, Jackson has been as solid a player as any for the Colonials at home, averaging 18.6 points and 9.2 rebounds in 26 career games at the Sewall Center. Jackson became just the second Colonial in school history to average over 20 points per game at home last season when he scored at a 20.8 points per game clip. The only other Colonial to average over 20 points per contest in a season in the Sewall Center's 22-year history was RMU all-time leading scorer Myron Walker (1990-94), who averaged 21.1 points per game as a sophomore in 1991-92. Jackson also has an opportunity to post the best career scoring average by a Colonial at the Sewall Center. That mark is also held by Walker at 18.5 points per game. Home Sweet Home - Robert Morris has learned to protect its home court at the Charles L. Sewall Center, as the Colonials notched a 96-72 win in its 2006-07 season opener over Florida International at home, a year after posting an 11-2 record at home. Thanks to a 10-3 record at the Sewall Center so far this season, RMU has posted a record of 51-26 (.662) at the home under sixth-year head coach Mark Schmidt. Overall in the 22-year history of the facility the Colonials have posted a record of 174-107 (.621).

Four on the Floor - Senior forward A.J. Jackson had his streak of 20+ point scoring games snapped at four when he finished with just eight points @ Monmouth (1/27/07). Despite that, it marked Jackson's second such streak of the 2006-07 season. In RMU's 4-0 start to the year, Jackson averaged 24.0 points per game and eclipsed the 20-point plateau in each contest. He became the first Colonial in school history to post a pair of streaks of at least four games scoring 20+ points in the same season and just the second player to turn the trick overall. Former Colonial Gene Nabors (1995-2000) also accomplished the feat twice, turning the trick in each of the 1998-99 and 1999-2000 campaigns. Jackson is also just the fifth player in school history to score at least 20 points in four straight games overall, as joining him and Nabors are former Colonials Myron Walker (1990-94), Keith Jones (1995-99) and Wesley Fluellen (1997-2002). Nabors is also the only Colonial in school history to have more than four games of scoring 20+ points in a contest, as he averaged 27.1 points over eight straight games late in the 1999-2000 season. Streakers - By finishing with eight points in a 59-56 setback @ Long Island, junior guard Tony Lee had his double-figure scoring streak snapped at 11 games. The streak was tied for the third longest by a Colonial on the active roster, and it also tied Lee's career-best streak. He scored in double figures in 11 straight contests from Jan. 26, 2006 to March 2, 2006. Senior forward A.J. Jackson currently owns the longest double-figure scoring streak, which is seven games.

2006 Northeast Conference Preseason Coaches Poll

According to a poll of league head coaches, Robert Morris was been picked to finish second in the Northeast Conference in 2006-07. It marks the highest preseason ranking for the Colonials ever, matching their second-place preseason prediction prior to the 1991-92 campaign. RMU received five firstplace votes, with the other six going to Monmouth, which was tabbed as the preseason favorite.

Following Monmouth and Robert Morris in the top five in the poll are Long Island, Central Connecticut State and Quinnipiac. The Blue Devils and Bobcats were picked to tie for fourth in the poll. Rounding out the annual poll is Wagner, Fairleigh Dickinson, St. Francis (N.Y.), Sacred Heart, Mount St. Mary's and Saint Francis (Pa.).

As well as being picked second in the preseason poll, Robert Morris placed senior forward A.J. Jackson on the 2006-07 NEC preseason all-conference team. Joining Jackson are forwards Margues Alston of Monmouth and Obie Nwadike of Central Connecticut State and guards Jarrid Frye of Sacred Heart and James Williams of Long Island.

Conducted annually, NEC coaches have failed to correctly forecast the eventual league champion since selecting Mount St. Mary's to win it all in 1998-99, and have proven inaccurate in 17 of the last 19 years.

This year marks the eighth time that Monmouth has been selected the Northeast Conference's preseason favorite by league head coaches, the most in conference history by a wide margin.

The Need for Three

The Colonials have relied heavily on the three-point shot under the direction of Mark Schmidt during his six years as head coach, with evidence the club's three-point field goal totals. In 2005-06 RMU shattered the team record for three-pointers with 260, eclipsing the club's old mark of 213, which was set in 2003-04. On the 2005-06 campaign, RMU averaged 8.97 three-pointers a game to lead the Northeast Conference. Since the start of the 2001-02 season, the Colonials lead the NEC in three-pointers made per game (7.46), ahead of Fairleigh Dickinson, which has averaged 6.99 three-pointers a contest.
