## APPLICATION GUIDELINES

Submit the non-refundable \$30 application fee with this application, or apply online for free at [www.rmu.edu](http://www.rmu.edu). If you apply during an on-campus interview or at one of our special events, we'll also waive the application fee.

To have standardized test scores sent directly to Robert Morris University, prospective students should use CEEB code 2769.

### First-time freshmen must submit the following:

- Official high school transcripts or a General Equivalency Diploma (GED) indicating successful completion of the program. Preference is given to students with a minimum 3.0 high school GPA.
- Official report of combined SAT or ACT scores. Preference is given to students who score a minimum combined SAT of 1000 (critical reading + math) or a composite ACT score of 22.

### Transfer students must submit the following:

- Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended. A minimum 2.0 GPA is required.
- If you have earned fewer than 30 college credits, please submit your high school transcript or a General Equivalency Diploma (GED) indicating successful completion of the program.

### International students must submit the following additional information:

- SAT or ACT scores are not required for international students. If you have taken SAT or ACT tests, arrange to have the scores sent directly to Robert Morris University.
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score is required if English is not the student's first language. Preference is given to undergraduate applicants with scores of 500 and above on the written test or 173 and above on the computer-based test.

To begin the admission process, complete this application and return it with your \$30 application fee.**

## FINANCING YOUR EDUCATION

Nearly 80 percent of our full-time undergraduate students receive financial aid (scholarships, grants, loans or work-study jobs) from University-funded, federal and state programs.

We cannot promise that you will qualify for financial aid, but we will do our best to help you receive all the aid possible. In order to receive the maximum consideration for financial aid, be sure to file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) in a timely manner. You should file your FAFSA by the deadline required by your state of residency (Pennsylvania's is May 1).

Robert Morris University is a Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) institution. Loan information will be forwarded to you by the Financial Aid Office.

## TYPES OF AID

### Grants and Scholarships

These are sometimes called gift aid because you won't have to repay them or work to earn them. Scholarships and grants are awarded on the basis of certain criteria.

University scholarship ranges are as follows:

\$500-\$4,500	2.5-2.99
\$1,000-\$6,500	3.0-3.49
\$1,500-\$7,500	3.5-3.99
\$2,000-\$8,000	4.0

### Educational Loans

These are a form of self-help that are subsidized by the federal government and carry lower interest rates than commercial loans. These loans must be repaid, generally after graduation or withdrawal from the University.

### Student Employment

The Federal College Work-Study Program is another form of self-help aid. Students at Robert Morris University who are awarded this aid are given the opportunity to interview for available positions on campus and work 15 to 20 hours per week.

## TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID, FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible after January 1. To file the FAFSA electronically, both you and your parents should request separate Personal Identification Numbers (PINs) at [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov). Then complete the FAFSA online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). RMU's FAFSA code is #003359.**
- 2. A Student Aid Report (SAR) will be sent to you via e-mail 7 to 10 days after you have submitted your FAFSA. If you are required to make corrections, do so online. If no corrections are required and you are chosen for verification, please sign and complete the verification worksheet and return it with copies of your 1040(s) to the Robert Morris University Financial Aid Office. If no corrections are required and you are not chosen for verification, you should keep the SAR for your records.**
- 3. Robert Morris University participates in the Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) program. If you want to apply for either a student loan or federal parent loan (PLUS), check "yes" next to the appropriate items on the FAFSA. If you intend to apply only for a loan, you must still submit a FAFSA.**
