## RMU Center for Veterans and Military Families Mission:

The RMU Center for Veterans and Military Families (CVMF) provides industry-leading support and services to veteran/military students and their families including holistic transition assistance that will be the cornerstone of their on-going personal, academic, and career success.

Provide industry-leading support, services, and facilities to veteran and military students and their families	CVMF students will have access to the CVMF facilities including study areas, a conference room, a computer lab, a kitchenette and the ACFT Training Gym. All CVMF students will receive weekly newsletter updates from the CVMF that provide information on military specific services including the Student Veteran Association (SVA) and support and resources offered on and outside of the RMU campus. VA VITAL is stationed on campus to offer clinical care, healthcare coordination, community resource connection and facilitate a mentorship program.
Deliver continual transition programs for veterans and military family members that will be the cornerstone to their ongoing success	Continue to collaborate with area VSOs to offer a semesterly Veterans Resource Showcase within the CVMF. Continue to offer career fair prep, resume writing and interview skills, as well as wellness outreach from our on-ground Veterans Integration to Academic Leadership (VITAL) coordinator.

## **CVMF Student Admission Process for the CVMF:**

Purpose: Implemented in alignment with the VA Principles of Excellence in mind so that the RMU offices provide a smooth, seamless admission transition for the CVMF student.

- Admission Counselors coordinate new admissions to the CVMF.
- CVMF sends a welcome email that includes the new student checklist, and the semester enrollment verification form.
- CVMF follows up with the new student orientation invite.
- CVMF sends a shopping sheet to the student.

## **CVMF New Student Orientation:**

Purpose: To provide CVMF students with an orientation that communicates the rules, regulations and policies the CVMF adheres to set forth by the VA, DOD and the SCO handbook, as well as, the facilities, resources, and services available.

- Multiple new student orientations, with different modalities, offered per semester.
- All students enrolled at RMU under the CVMF umbrella can attend.
- Refresher courses, a scaled down version of the new student orientation designed for continuing students, are sent to students throughout the year and accessible on the CVMF webpage. These are typically sent out before each semester's registration period.

## **CVMF, VA and DoD Education Student Specific Policies:**

Purpose: In accordance with the VA's Principles of Excellence, specific RMU policies have been put into place to ensure VA compliance and that each VA and DOD education student is maximizing their VA and DOD educational benefits and experience.

- Schedule changes need to be reported to the CVMF by the VA and DOD education students.
- A withdrawal form must be submitted to the CVMF if a VA or DOD education student would like to withdraw from a course(s). RMU's withdrawal policy is stated within the Financial Services webpage. RMU's military tuition assistance withdrawal policy is listed within the Student Financial Services webpage under Title IV Refund calculation, tuition assistance program.

- Students will be notified if the CDR (cohort default rate) rises above the national average. The Office of Financial Aid will communicate this rate to students. RMU students also participate in the College Affordability Academy.

- Active-duty, National Guard, and Reserve students and their families have the ability to utilize the RMU Deployment Policy.

- If a VA or DOD education student would like to change their major, a change of major form must be submitted to the CVMF.

- Student Financial Services will either not assess or waive all late fees for students receiving VA or DOD educational benefits.
- VA education students will submit an enrollment verification to the CVMF each semester they would like to utilize their VA educational benefits. Students will then be certified to the VA each academic semester adhering to the SCO handbook rules and regulations.

## **CVMF Student Recruitment Practices:**

Purpose: Prohibition of High-Pressure Recruiting Tactics

Robert Morris University prohibits the use of high-pressure recruitment tactics such as making multiple unsolicited contacts (3 or more), including contacts by phone, email, or in-person, and engaging in same-day recruitment and registration to secure service member enrollments.

Robert Morris University prohibits the payment of any commission, bonus, or other incentive payment based directly or indirectly on securing enrollments or federal financial aid to any persons or entities engaged in any student recruiting, admission activities, or making decisions regarding the award of student financial assistance.

**RMU CAREER OUTCOMES SUCCESS RATES:**

RMU uses the phrase "Career Outcomes Success Rate" instead of "Placement Rate" in reporting. The Career Outcomes Success Rate includes graduates that are employed (full and part time), in the military, or continuing their education after graduation. ### Upon RMU admission:

### Before each semester:

- Contact your VR&E Counselor if this is your first semester at RMU. They must submit your VR&E authorization to RMU each semester; they will not do this if you do not keep in contact with them and submit the necessary documentation they require.
- Submit the CVMF enrollment verification form. You can access this through our webpage, <https://www.rmu.edu/about/military>, under "important resources."
- Purchase your textbooks.
  - You are automatically enrolled into RMU's Book Bundle:

  - Digital books will be automatically delivered to your digital bookshelf in Blackboard. You will be able to access your course materials no earlier than a week before the semester starts.
  - If you opt out of the Book Bundle or would like to request physical textbooks, contact the Bookstore via [rmu@bkstr.com](mailto:rmu@bkstr.com)
  - Fall 2023- physical books can be picked up a week before the semester begins at the UPMC Events Center, contact the bookstore if you have any questions.
- Purchase your supplies through the bookstore and/or *RMUstore.com*. You will have a max of \$35 to spend on supplies unless otherwise noted in your VR&E authorization provided by your VR&E Counselor.
- Opt out of RMU's health insurance (link on the EV form) before your first semester of enrollment AND before each fall semester- **VR&E will not pay for RMU health insurance.**

### After each semester:
